From the Principal:

Teaching and Learning

Last Wednesday evening saw the completion of our Parent Information Sessions. At each of the sessions from Kindergarten to Year 6 the teachers spoke to parents about their teaching of Literacy and Numeracy. In particular they explained the classroom strategies that are in place each and every day to ensure that as a school we are sharply focused on

"improving the outcomes for all students in their literacy and numeracy learning".

In numeracy this looks like:-

Tracking all students through the Maths Assessment Interview followed by a consistent approach to teaching through warm-ups, rich learning tasks and reflections. In all grades teachers know the learning profile for every student in their class.

In literacy this looks like:-

Teaching a balanced 100 minute Literacy block every day in which the children experience explicit and focused reading and writing instruction based on the integration of rich literature. In all grades the teachers know the reading and writing levels of their children and plan differentiated tasks accordingly.

Throughout the year the teachers will be monitoring the learning growth of all the children so that they can ensure that learning programmes cater for the children's needs.

Children's Workbooks coming home on Friday, 14th March

In Week 7 the children will be bringing home their Mathematics workbooks. We encourage you to talk to your child about their exciting learnings this term. Some conversation starters might include:-



Show me a piece of work that you are really proud of in this book?

What new skills have you learnt in mathematics?

What was the learning intent for this piece of work?

Are there areas that you would like to improve in and why?

The children are extremely proud of their work and will be delighted if you are able to write a comment to them in their book. We encourage you to write this comment after their last piece of work. Children really do enjoy receiving feedback from you and they also like to know that you are aware of what they are doing at school. Your comment also allows the teacher to see that you were able to take the time to walk through the book with your child. You are asked to return the book promptly on Monday 17th March so that your child can continue their written work in the appropriate book.


Parent Maths Workshop

Litter Management

St Bernadette's is joining a growing number of schools that are developing simple and effective strategies to reduce litter and the school's impact on the environment.



We have realised that we can dramatically reduce the amount of litter in the school by:

- having children bring a reusable lunch box and drink bottle each day
- having all students sit down to eat morning tea and lunch in a dedicated area before playing. This simple strategy has not only meant that the children take greater responsibility for their litter but that they spend less time cleaning up litter that they have dropped while they are walking around eating. This strategy has also resulted in less food wastage.
- introducing recycling composting bins for the children to place fresh food scraps into and then using these on our school gardens
- requesting that parents try to minimise the amount of packaging that they send to school in the children's lunch boxes
- asking children to take home clean rubbish eg paper, plastic wraps, foils
- encouraging children to bring drinks to school in a drink bottle rather than bringing tetra packs (an audit of tetra drink packs disposed of in our garbage bins reveals that most of these drink packs still contain 25%- 50% of their contents when they are thrown in the bin)


REMINDER: for student absences

Application for Exemption From Attendance at School

Schools in the Parramatta Diocese have been informed that when families request to take their child(ren) out of school during term time it is necessary for them now to complete an Application for Exemption From Attendance at School form (PRIOR to taking your child out of school). This form can be downloaded from the school website (PARENTS/NOTES FROM SCHOOL/ADMINISTRATION FORMS/STUDENT ATTENDANCE). On completion, the form is to be sent to the school office so that a Certificate of Exemption from Attendance at School can be issued to parents. Parents are advised that when this certificate is issued they will need to have this with them during the period of exemption that has been granted. This certificate is a legal document. All applications for leave must be sent to the office 3 weeks prior to departure.

If the absence is to attend a funeral, music or ballet exam then just a note of explanation to Mrs Nettleton is sufficient. Mrs Nettleton will then confirm the absence with a letter.
