#### From the Principal:

#### What's Happening in Learning at St Bernadette's

You will notice that in the classrooms and when the children are talking to you about their learning you will see and hear references to 'Learning Intentions' and 'Success Criteria'.

Learning Intentions and Success Criteria give students clarity and purpose around their learning. They assist the children to understand what they are learning and how they can demonstrate to the teacher and to their peers that they have successfully learnt or acquired a skill, concept or strategy. In other words, the Learning Intent shows the students what they are aiming for and the Success Criteria show the students how to get there. If the teacher has explained the learning intention clearly, students from Kindergarten to Year 6 are able to articulate the learning that is taking place.



When I visit the children in their classrooms I engage the students in a learning conversation by asking them the following set of questions:-

What are you learning? How are you doing? How do you know? How can you improve? Where do you go for help?

I encourage parents to join the learning conversation by asking your children, 'what is one thing you learnt today'? If you get negative responses, it might be a good time to come and chat to your child's teacher.

#### **Brisbane Road Entrance to the School**

Parents who park in Brisbane Road and need access to the school in the afternoon to collect their children at 2:45pm, enter the school via the bottom gate in the lower car park area. Some parents have been endeavouring to use the laneway access from Brisbane Road. This access remains closed until opened by COSHC staff after 2:45pm. This is a safety precaution for our school and the COSHC. As you are aware it is important that all access to the site is through designated and supervised entry points throughout the day. Thank you for accessing the school via the designated points.

#### **Mid Year Reports**

Reports for the first semester of the year will be distributed at the end of this term and at St Bernadette's we will be transitioning to the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta system school report. This is an opportunity for the school to incorporate the new syllabus documents as they are implemented over the next 3 years. The mid year report will look a little different, as it will include an overall grade for each Key Learning Area and then a brief comment from the class teacher about your child's performance in Religious Education, English and Mathematics as well as an overall comment. An important component of reporting at mid year is the Parent Teacher Interview. You are invited to attend the next Parents and Friends Meeting where we will be explaining the new report format.

- A describes students who have an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content. They have a very high level of competence and can apply the skills and knowledge to new situations.
- **B** describes students who have a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content. They have a high level of competence and are able to apply the skills and knowledge in most situations.
- **C** describes students who have achieved a sound understanding of the content and skills and have an adequate level of competence in these areas.
- **D** describes students who have achieved a basic understanding and knowledge of the content and skills and have a limited level of competence.
- E describes students who have achieved an elementary knowledge and understanding of the content with teacher.



#### REMINDER: for student absences

#### Application for Exemption From Attendance at School

Schools in the Parramatta Diocese have been informed that when families request to take their child(ren) out of school, for more than 3 days, during term time, it is necessary for them now to complete an **Application for Exemption From Attendance at School** form (**PRIOR** to taking your child out of school). This form can be downloaded from the school website (**PARENTS/NOTES FROM SCHOOL/ADMINISTRATION FORMS/STUDENT ATTENDANCE**). On completion, the form is to be sent to the school office so that a **Certificate of Exemption from Attendance at School** can be issued to parents. Parents are advised that when this certificate is issued they will need to have this with them during the period of exemption that has been granted. This certificate is a legal document. All applications for leave must be sent to the office **3** weeks prior to departure.

If the absence is to attend a funeral, music or ballet exam then just a note of explanation to Mrs Nettleton is sufficient. Mrs Nettleton will then confirm the absence with a letter.

#### **Child Protection**

A reminder for parents who are required to **'UPDATE'** their child protection and for **'NEW'** parents to the school.

It is a Diocesan requirement that parents who volunteer at school must complete the CEO Online Child Protection Module. This training is available online at: <a href="http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au">http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au</a> and MUST be completed every two years.

All parents must have completed the above prior to helping in the classroom, on excursions, sport days, tuckshop, uniform shop or any help around the school.
