
Children in Kindergarten may put their money in an envelope/snap lock bag clearly marked with their name and 'Fathers Day Stall' so that their teacher can help them.



A reminder for parents who are required to **'UPDATE'** their child protection and for **'NEW'** parents to the school.



It is a Diocesan requirement that parents who volunteer at school must complete the Child Protection Module ONLINE. This training is available online at:

All parents must have completed the above prior to helping in the classroom, on excursions, sport days, tuckshop, uniform shop or any help around the school.
