Frequency of the School Newsletter

Beginning of School Year Parent Teacher Interviews

In response to Parent and Teacher feedback, this year teachers will be conducting 10 minute 1:1 interviews with parents instead of Parent Information Sessions. These interviews are opportunities for you to meet the class teacher and discuss your child. You are invited to book an appointment with your child's teacher using the School Interviews site. An email will be sent to all parents with full details shortly. General Grade information will be communicated to you by the teachers via Grade Overviews.

Support Programmes at St Bernadette's

In 2015 we will offer the following support programmes in addition to the inclass support given to children K - 6:

- ⇒ 3 EMU Specialist Support programmes to Year One students requiring assistance in numeracy,
- ⇒ the Reading Recovery programme for those children in Year One who are having difficulty with beginning reading skills
- ⇒ an EMU specialist programme will be offered to Year 4 students requiring assistance in numeracy.
- ⇒ Early morning reading programme offered by the learning support staff
- ⇒ Counselling student and family accessed via referral (please approach class teacher, Mrs Hord or Mrs Nettleton if you require information).

Student Workbooks

This year you will have the opportunity to view your child's workbooks twice a term. This will help you to be informed about your child's learning as it is happening.



When your child brings home their books we encourage you to write a comment to your child in their book after their last piece of work. More information about which books will be coming home will be communicated in later newsletters.

Changes to Student Attendance Guidelines commencing 2015

You will be aware of reports in the media that have referred to student's attendance at school – particularly in relation to discouraging children being removed from school during school term.

As part of the implementation of the newly formulated National Standards, holidays taken by students outside of school vacation periods will now be included in Student Attendance Data as absences. A Certificate of Exemption can no longer be granted for this purpose. Families are encouraged to holiday or travel during school vacations. If travel during school term is necessary the following considerations and procedures apply:

If the principal accepts the reason for the absence, the absence will be marked as "L" in the class roll. In such cases leave of ten (10) or more school days will require parents to submit a formal application for leave in writing. This letter of request should be addressed to the Principal prior to commencing the leave period, indicating the specific reason or purpose for the request of leave. You are requested to submit this letter at least 3 weeks prior to leave taking place.

If the principal does not believe the absence is in the student's best interests and does not accept the reason, the absence is deemed unjustified and will be recorded as "A" in the Class roll.

There is no longer a **Student Exemption Form.** Please discard any master copy that you have saved because it is no longer valid nor recognised by the Board of Studies.

Anaphylaxis

At 5t Bernadette's this year there are a number of children who experience anaphylaxis - in particular a severe allergic reaction when they are exposed to peanuts and nut related products. If those children are exposed to these foods a severe allergic reaction can occur within 20 minutes of exposure and can rapidly become life threatening. Accidental exposure to these foods can happen at eating times and in the case of one of our students, the allergic reaction can be triggered when another person has touched or eaten these foods and then that person touches them.

As a community we can assist these children by making our school environment safe. We ask families to:

- NOT use peanut, nut and chocolate spreads when making and sending sandwiches to school.
- NEVER send nuts to school for your own child to eat
- remind children NOT to share their food with other children at school
- explain to your children the seriousness of food allergies for those children who are
 affected by them and that we can help to keep these children safe by the choices we
 make.

Award System at St Bernadette's

The children at St Bernadette's are recognised for their behaviour, work habits and school performance in many ways within the classroom, at various assemblies and through various award opportunities.

- Each Monday we recognise our Birthday children for that week
- In weeks 3, 5, 7 and 9 (in Term 1) children from each class will be recognised in the following categories:
 - Student of the Week
 - Social Skill
 - Merit certificates
- Behaviour leading to a Principal's Award—children then have a morning tea with Mrs Nettleton at the end of the term. A letter advises students of the date and time.
- At the end of each term two students from the entire student body are awarded the School Values Award

Children will be acknowledged in newsletters to follow each of these awards so that our community can celebrate with the children.

Social Skill: Being a great friend at St. Bernadette's.

Our social skill for Weeks 2 & 3 is looking at the ways we can be a great friend at our school. Within our class groups we have been discussing our school values and how they help us to be a friend.

With the start of a new school year we are welcoming to all we meet and endeavour to make new friends not only in our class, our grade but across the whole school.

We can do this by: getting to know people, being a good listener, accepting people as they are, asking them about themselves, being a positive person and talking about the good things in our school and at home.

If we all take the time to meet new people, nurture our existing friendships, then we create a very friendly school community.

STUDENTS ABSENT ON CENSUS DAY



If your child is absent on this day, a signed written explanation giving a reason for the absence **MUST** be sent to the school by close of business on **13th February** with an anticipated return to school date. This is an audit requirement so your assistance in this matter would be greatly appreciated.

Supervision

We start at 8am with the morning supervision of the students.



In the afternoons, all the children are supervised on to buses, at Tuckshop, across roads, to after school care or while waiting for the Car Pick Up Service.

School finishes at <u>2.45pm</u> - your collection of children at this time is very much appreciated.

Uniform

St. Bernadette's has a fine reputation in the wider community and the way in which our children wear the school uniform reflects on all students. Parents are urged to ensure that their children are wearing the uniform correctly. Please remember to label **ALL** clothing and school items.

Birthday Cakes

If parents do need to send in a birthday cake for their child's birthday, teachers would prefer cur

teachers would prefer cup cakes.

This makes distribution in the classroom so much easier without the safety issues of bringing a knife into the class to cut the cake.

Library—General Information

The library is an educational centre for both students and staff. It is a valuable resource where children can study as a class, group or individuals.

The Library is open Monday to Thursday from 8.30 to 2.45pm. The library is supervised at lunchtime 1.20 to 1.40pm and the children may visit Monday to Wednesday. The Library is closed at recess.

Borrowing limits for children vary according to the child's grade:

Kindergarten	1 book at a time
Year 1 and 2	2 books at a time
Year 3 and 4	3 books at a time
Years 5 and 6	4 books at a time



Students visit the library once a week for Library lessons and borrowing, but may borrow more often if they are avid readers. They must however return books before new ones can be loaned.

- Students are encouraged to choose a suitable book themselves as this develops their tastes and skills. However this does not always occur. Please contact me if you are concerned.
- Borrowing is encouraged over the school holidays (excluding Christmas) for recreational reading.
- A Library bag is required by the children when borrowing.
- ♦ All books should be returned after 2 weeks.

Late Books

After the due date (i.e. 2 weeks after the book was borrowed) the book is overdue.

Books may be renewed if students need more time to finish reading the book.

Overdue notices are issued to students once per term.

Long term overdue notices are issued as a message to parents.

Lost or Damaged Books

If you think a book has been lost or damaged, please contact the library.

We will:

- check the shelves to ensure that the item has not been returned. (It may not have been scanned or incorrectly scanned.)
- ask to check with your child's classroom teacher to make sure it is not in with the classroom books or reading books.
- request payment to replace the book.

Book Club

The Scholastic Book Club is run by the P&F once a term. The children have the opportunity to purchase books for information and recreational reading. Reward points from Book Club are used to purchase books for the classroom libraries.

Shade Structure

The top court shade structure will be replaced throughout this term with a hard roof structure the same as the one that covers the bottom court.

This will make two weather proof outside areas for the school.
