QUALITY CATHOLIC SCHOOLS SURVEY

All Catholic schools in the Diocese of Parramatta will once again be participating in the Quality Catholic Schooling (QCS) survey. The QCS survey provides information from students, staff and parents about our school's cultural behaviour, relationships and learning community, and assists us in our focus on continuous improvement. Between 13th and 20th March all staff, students from Years 5 and 6, and 60 randomly-selected parents will be asked to complete an online survey.


Staff and students will complete the survey online at school. Parents will be sent home a paper survey but will also be able to complete the survey online if preferred.

This year we will be able to get even more information about the link between student wellbeing and learning outcomes. To do this we will need to include a student identifier in the student survey. The survey will remain confidential and individual survey responses will not be accessible by the school or the Catholic Education Office. An independent survey consultant (Insight SRC) who manages the data collection will ensure the survey data is kept strictly confidential. Each school will receive a de-identified information report at the end of May to help them to develop strategies for further improvement. While this is a change from previous years, it will definitely help us in working with all students to improve their learning. If you have concerns, please feel free to contact Mr Visser.

As a parent, if you are randomly selected to complete the survey (which has been sent home today), we would encourage your participation as this will help our school to identify our strengths and areas in which we can focus our improvement.

Teacher Professional Learning and Leave Entitlements

Like professionals in other fields, all teachers are required to keep up to date with current thinking on best practices and new developments in education. From time to time teachers are required to attend professional development opportunities to learn about changes to curriculum, new methods of teaching & learning and other ways of integrating technology. These sessions sometimes occur during the day, after school or in the school holidays. Teachers also have entitlements such as long service leave,



learning continues and routines are kept. We thank you for your support in this matter.

Early Years Reading Assessments

Teachers of Kindergarten and Year One are currently administering reading assessments to every child in their class. These are a one-on-one assessment interview and provide teachers with diagnostic information about your child's readiness for reading (Kindergarten) and ongoing reading development (Year One).

NSW STATE ELECTION:

Did you know? Catholic schools support increased Government funding for ALL schools—government and non government—because each school is an integral part of NSW's economic and social infrastructure. Every student is entitled to receive the best education possible, regardless of the school they attend. This is why funding support from Federal and State Governments must keep pace with rising education costs—to maintain education quality and to ensure a Catholic education remains affordable for all families.

FAQ 's ABOUT MATHS HOMEWORK

Multiplication is taught from the first year of primary school.

Does my child still need to learn their tables?

Yes. Table memorisation allows children to have the automaticity when they are performing quick calculations. In the same way that sight word knowledge is important for fluent reading, table knowledge assists children with fluency in computations.

Challenge: Learning times tables is not the same as understanding multiplication and division. Rather it is about memorising. Effective mathematicians can apply their understanding of multiplication and division to real life situations because they understand the strategies and representations of multiplication (and division) as they occur in a wide range of contexts. In 2014 NAPLAN this looked like using multiplicative reasoning and understanding to apply multiplication strategies and facts. The questions below appeared in the 2014 Year 3 and 5 NAPLAN Papers:-

Sue needs to buy 16 hats for a party.

The hats are sold in packets of 5

How many packets does she need to buy?

AND

Matt and his friends are putting up some tents.

Each tent needs 8 pegs. Each peg can only be used for one tent. They have 100 pegs.

What is the maximum number of tents they can put up?

AND

Sam has \$1,20 in 5 – cent coins.

How many 5-cent coins does Sam have?

AND

A shop sells cupcakes in trays and boxes.

Each tray holds 6 cupcakes.

Each box holds 8 cupcakes.

Molly buys a total of 50 cupcakes.

She buys 4 boxes and some trays.

How many trays does Molly buy?

ANZAC Day 2015

You will recall that last year, every student at the school decorated and wrote on a wooden cross as part of the Australian War Memorial's Commemorative Crosses Project. These crosses have now left Australia bound for a number of countries around the world to be placed on Australian military personnel's graves.

As part of commemorating ANZAC Day in its Centenary Year, the student leaders have already attended the launch of the Educational Kit at Castle Hill RSL last week. The kit has some wonderful activities for the students across the school.

Already this term, students have been involved in the ANZAC Writing competitions with some wonderful entries. In the coming weeks, students will be participating in recording the names of service men and women for projection in the Remembering Voices soundscape at the Australian War Memorial.

Our leaders will also attend and lay a wreath at the Centenary of ANZAC Sunday Commemoration Service on April 19th held at the Centenary of ANZAC Reserve, Castle Hill. A large digital screen will be used so that all attendees can see the Service. The Centenary of Sunday ANZAC address will be delivered by Major General Paul Symon AO.

In the week leading up to ANZAC Day the school will commemorate it with a variety of activities culminating in a liturgy and further activities on Friday 24th April and our leaders attending and laying a wreath at the Dawn Service on April 25th.

Your children will be invited to prepare a short oral presentation about that person that can be recorded before the end of Term 1 and placed on the school's Facebook page in Week 1 of Term 2.


