On Monday, Senior Constable Rob Paterson had his yearly visit to St Bernadette's to talk to Years 4 to 6 about bullying, social media and inappropriate behaviour. The comments below represent some of the key messages from Senior Constable Paterson.

Constable Rob was talking to us today about how important it is for us not to be on social media and apps that are not appropriate for our age group. For instance, KiK is the most dangerous app to use because it is for the 17+ age group and is not suitable for our age group. When you are on KiK, strangers try to add us as friends, and try to gain important information from us and they might not be we think they are.

Constable Rob was very helpful to us. He explained how any type of bullying is unacceptable and would not be tolerated. Bullying is repeated verbal, physical, social or psychological behaviour that is harmful to the person that is being targeted. If **YOU ARE BEING BULLIED**, tell a responsible adult, such as your parents, relatives, teachers, kids helpline (1800 55 1800) or the police.


