WHY IS THE FUN FAIR ALWAYS ON A FRIDAY?

We re visit this issue each year and find ourselves in a similar situation. Most St Bernadette's families have sport on Saturdays which would prevent many from being able to enjoy the Fun Fair for the entire day and a couple of hours is never enough fun for the kids. Additionally, because our kids need to be driven to sport, we wouldn't have enough volunteers to run our stalls for a full day. Sunday's aren't an option for the school because Mass is on and parishioners need access to the car park and school grounds where we set up our rides and stalls. Plus, Friday afternoons are a really social time, summer is coming, weather is warming up and families are ready to wind down for the weekend! Another bonus is that children are able to stay on at school on the Friday and meet their parents when they arrive to attend the Fun Fair.

WHY DON'T WE OPEN THE FUN FAIR TO INDEPENDENT VENDORS AND MARKET STALL HOLDERS?

St Bernadette's P&F have always planned around the Fun Fair being our biggest fundraising event which is why it's held every 2 years. An annual event would be a big ask on parents and organisers. With this in mind, we make no secret that our aim is to always generate as much fundraising as we can for resources and improvements to the school. Obviously independent stall holders need to make money and therefore we could only charge them between \$100-\$250 to have a stall at the Fun Fair (other schools only charge \$50 per stall). Each of our stalls generates a minimum of \$600-\$7000 per stall in profit for the P&F so we prefer to run as many stalls ourselves so that our community benefits from the day itself.

HOW MUCH DO YOU MAKE? WHAT IS DONE WITH THE MONEY?

In 2013 we made \$65,000 profit which was donated to the school for the bottom court shade structure (COLA). This year the school is aiming to have the top court shade structure ready for the Fun Fair but the funds will contribute to this cost as well as the purchase of a stage and new basketball hoops for school so we have a BIG target to hit this year and we won't be able to achieve this without your help!

I WANT TO HELP BUT I WORK FULL TIME OR I HAVE TODDLERS

There are plenty of opportunities for parents to help and we will take all the help we can get! Come along to the meetings and find out how! During the year we ask our families for a number of donations and there are plenty of ways to assist even if you have little people at home!

Our cake stall is famous for our cakes and sweet treats because our school has some of the most talented cake makers in the Hills District! If you're a baker, why not make a few extra items for the cake stall.
