I am so proud to be the Principal of such a generous school community. On a daily basis the children are living out our school values off 'care and compassion'.

Over the last months the children at St Bernadette's and their families have supported many needy causes at the same time as raised awareness in the wider community of the needs of others.

The Student Representative Council (SRC) has been very active in supporting Purple Day; raising awareness about epilepsy and Allergy Awareness Week; developing the understanding of our school community about the effects of allergies on 1 in every 10 children.

Over the last two weeks through our 'Dig Deep for Nepal' campaign our school has raised a significant amount of money - **\$950** that will help CARITAS to provide shelter, food and water to the Nepalese people whose lives and community have been so devastatingly affected by the recent earthquake in that region.

Today the children's generosity continued as they donated a gold coin to the works of the Diocesan Works Fund (DWF) and raised **\$804**.

We truly are a community that supports our words with powerful actions that make a difference to others.

Pentecost
