
### **CHANGING SCHOOLS**

To estimate enrolments for 2016, it would be appreciated if the school could be notified in writing of any children who may be leaving St Bernadette's at the end of the year, from grades other than Year 6. Thank you.

### **COMPULSORY STUDENT ATTENDANCE**

The Education Act 1990 requires your child to attend school each day that instruction is provided, unless they are sick or there is another good reason for their inability to attend. Parents are required to explain their child's absence within the following seven days. Not doing so means that an unjustified absence will be recorded on the class roll. Teachers are also required to record lateness and part day absences on the class roll. If your child is late, or if you pick your child up during the school day, you are required to come in to the office to complete a Late Arrival or Early Dismissal note . This week, letters were sent home from Mr Visser to those parents that have not provided a written explanation for their child's absence. Parents are urged to respond to this letter ASAP.

## **Maths Presentation on Addition and Subtraction**

On Monday evening, the Maths Lead Team presented an opportunity for parents to find out more about how and what we teach in Mathematics to the children. We teach what is outlined for each grade according to the 'new' Mathematics syllabus – something of which not all parents were aware.

During the evening, there was opportunity for those attending to provide feedback to the Team regarding parents' needs and questions.

One item that was raised revolved around parents' understanding of the current terminology involved in Mathematics. Parents noted that having a better understanding of this would greatly assist them with their children's homework. Some of these terms and their meanings are presented below. Further terms will be added each week, and any you would like explained, please email Peter Visser at the school and we will include these in future newsletters.


**Number Bust** - breaking a number down through an operation. 144 might be 72 x 2 or 3 x 48 or 288/2 or 1/3 of 432 or 68 + 76

**Known Facts** – knowledge children have that springs immediately to mind e.g. children automatically know that 7 + \_\_\_ = 10, that the missing number is 3 and do not need to write it out or use concrete materials, etc. to work it out

**Think Boards** – often the teachers will present the real life situation and the children complete the Materials, Symbol and Picture sections



**Triads** – where the children think about numbers and look at the language – the words to describe that number, what it looks like with counters, etc. and how it is written or recorded
