A parable is told of a farmer who owned an old mule. The mule fell into the farmer's well. Instead he called his neighbours together and told them what happened, and enlisted them to help haul dirt to bury the old mule in the well and put him out of his misery.

Initially, the old mule was hysterical! But as the farmer and his neighbours continued shovelling and the dirt hit his back, a thought struck him. It suddenly dawned on him that every time a shovel load of dirt landed on his back, he could shake it off and step up! This he did blow after blow. He repeatedly encouraged himself, no matter how painful the blows, or distressing the situation seemed, the old mule fought panic, and just kept right on shaking it off and stepping up. What seemed like it would bury him actually blessed him ... all because of the manner in which he handled his adversity. That's life!

If we face our problems and respond to them positively, and refuse to give in to panic, bitterness or self-pity; the adversities that come along to bury us usually have within them the potential to benefit and bless us!

Remember forgiveness, faith, prayer, praise and hope are all excellent ways to **Shake it off and step up** out of the wells in which we find ourselves.






Lifeline Book Fair—Oakhill College
