There is no doubt that our earliest relationships provide a model for all our future relationships, and learning to trust other people as feeling, thoughtful human beings, will form the basis for having happy, satisfying relationships.

To develop these happy, satisfying relationships, we need to have a sense of 'others'. That is from a very early age we begin to see ourselves as part of a network of important people who love and care for us and who we love and care for too. It is in the family home that children learn to be considerate, tolerant and respectful; this learning comes through parental guidance and example. Actions really do speak louder than words.

When children are polite, kind, honest and cooperative, they develop character and exhibit social skills that help others feel comfortable. These relationship building skills, also help children, and adults, to get on with friends and neighbours and, if the occasion arises, to resolve differences of opinion in a courteous and healthy way.

As adult role models we have an important role to play in guiding our children to celebrate difference amongst their friends rather than be frightened of it or threatened by it. Children learn this firstly within their family and then at school. Assisting our children in this area equips them with a great life skill.

Canteen Procedures

- Parents are asked to ensure that children who wish to purchase lunch from the canteen do so via a lunch order. This can be done either through the MunchMonitor website or by a lunch order brought into school. Please do not give your child money to purchase their lunch over the counter.
- Children who order milkshakes need to eat their lunch first and then go to the canteen with their lunch order bag and collect their milkshake.

School Hours

The school day commences at 8.30am. It is the responsibility of every parent to have their child at school before the bell goes at 8.30am. Arriving in the school driveway, car park or at the entrance gate does not count as having your child at school on time. Children who habitually arrive after the bell are being taught by their families that it is OK to be tardy and that in life punctuality is not a priority or a necessity. Work places, sporting activities and even creative arts performances all require those attending to be on time. If your children are habitually late you are urged to please address this situation now.

Christmas Toy Appeal

This term all classes have focused on their Mission Unit. They have learnt that mission and service are following Jesus' greatest commandment, "To love one another as I have loved you." As part of our mission focus we have looked at the neighbours we can help. We raised money to send to Cambodia, for the mobile schools that are helping teach the children who can't afford to go to school. We also spoke about the Indigenous community in Wadeye, Northern Territory where children may only receive a piece of fruit for Christmas, so we have asked children to donate a small toy for The Wadeye Christmas Appeal by **Friday 18th November**.
