Next Tuesday is Shrove Tuesday. 'Shrove' means being forgiven for wrong doings. Another name for Shrove Tuesday is Pancake Day. A long time ago this was a day for feasting and having a good time. People went to church to confess the bad things they had done and would be forgiven before the start of Lent. Wednesday, 1st March is Ash Wednesday and this marks the beginning of Lent. The season of Lent goes for forty days and is a time for Catholics to prepare for Easter. Lent is usually a time of fasting and repentance as well as a time for reflecting on Christ's suffering and sacrifices for us.

On Ash Wednesday, Years 3 to 6 will attend the 9:15am Parish Mass and the 12 noon Parish Mass. They will receive the ashes on their forehead and hear these words 'turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel'. The Infants grades will have their own special liturgy in the hall.

Catholic Schools Week

Monday 6th March is Catholic Schools week. In Catholic Schools Week we celebrate the joyful and distinctive character of a distinctive school. The week is designed to be a celebration for all those who have a stake in our school community, students, staff, parents, families, priests and Parishioners.

We are beginning our celebration with a **Prayer** Liturgy on Monday 6th March on Top Court at 8:30am.

On Wednesday 8 March we will open classrooms between 11:15 and 1pm. We would like to invite

parents to come and share the joy of their school experience with their child and small groups of children. You might have a memory box of mementos from your school days that you could bring along to share. This will be a wonderful way to celebrate



our theme for this year, 'Learning Connected.'

Monday Mornings

Our attendance data reveals that a number of St Bernadette's students regularly arrive late to school on a Monday morning. Our school day commences at 8:30am and concludes at 2:45pm. Monday morning assemblies are an important part of our school week and it is very disappointing for your child if they miss the announcements and presentations that happen at these assemblies because they have arrived late to school. Arriving on time at school includes arriving on time on Mondays. It is important that you know that every child who arrives late on a Monday (just like any other day) has their attendance marked with a partial absence.

Congratulations to all those children who arrive at school ready for assemblies.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Starting this week, we will be posting a more realistic representation of the students' actual attendance at the school. The past two weeks' figures have been generalised from a less accurate set of data. The new figures more accurately reflect students' actual attendance.

Currently we are sitting at 88.7%. This is below the expected [minimum target of 90%].

The main reason for the lower figure [accounting for almost 40% of all absences] is the number of students accompanying families on 'holidays' during the term. We need to remain mindful that attending school everyday throughout the term, on time every day, is what's important and most essential for the students' learning.
