R.E. NEWS



Sunday is The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is also known as the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, which translates from Latin to "Body of Christ."

The feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, celebrates and commemorates the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. Although the liturgy on Holy Thursday remembers the celebration of the Last Supper, its focus tends to be more aligned with the events of

the Passion rather than on the institution of the Eucharist. In the 13th Century, Pope Urban IV established the feast of Corpus Christi (the Body of Christ) and it was St Thomas Aquinas who composed the

official prayers of the Church for the feast day. In 1970 the feast was changed to the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. In some countries it is celebrated on the Thursday following Trinity Sunday and in others on the following Sunday.

In John's gospel passage, Jesus speaks a number of times about his followers eating his flesh and drinking his blood; 'For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink.' In the Eucharist, we celebrate the 'real presence' of Jesus, understanding that bread and wine is changed into the body and blood of Christ. This change does not occur in a physical, observable way. The Church teaches that the 'substance' of bread and wine (what makes them bread and wine in essence) is changed but not the physical attributes. This is known as 'transubstantiation' – change of substance.

Why are we asking your children to attend the Mid Year School Report Interviews?

In Week 9 when the teachers meet with you about your child's learning, we are asking you to bring your child to the meeting. This is an opportunity for teachers, children and parents to acknowledge the progress and achievement that has been made in the first semester of the school year. The children will talk about their learning achievements as well as their learning goals. Parents will have the opportunity to ask questions both of the teacher and of their child. The interviews will vary slightly across the grades depending on the age of the children.

Reports for the first semester of the year will be distributed towards the end of this term. Students in Kindergarten will receive a report where the level of achievement is reported on using a scale of Working Towards, Working At and Working Beyond. Years 1 to 6 have an A to E reporting system.

- A describes students who have an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content. They have a very high level of competence and can apply the skills and knowledge to new situations.
- **B** describes students who have a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content. They have a high level of competence and are able to apply the skills and knowledge in most situations.
- **C** describes students who have achieved a sound understanding of the content and skills and have an adequate level of competence in these areas.
- **D** describes students who have achieved a basic understanding and knowledge of the content and skills and have a limited level of competence.
- **E** describes students who have achieved an elementary knowledge and understanding of the content with teacher.

To put the A-E reporting system into perspective, it may be helpful to look at the analogy below for driving a car. Where do you fit on the scale?

Maths Corner

WHY IS MATHS TAUGHT DIFFERENTLY NOW?

Telling or asking?

Many of us were taught Maths through telling. Our teachers told us how to 'do' maths and then we 'practised' until we could 'do' it independently...if we were 'told' how to 'do' it and 'did' it often enough, it was believed that understanding would then follow...

...in many cases, understanding never followed, whether or not we could 'do' the maths...it was thought that we 'understood' if we arrived at the correct answer. If we didn't arrive at the correct answer, we were simply 'told' how to 'do' it again!

We now know that this is not an effective way to develop deep understanding of Maths. Maths is concept based, not skill based. Understanding of one concept is needed to understand others. Children need to develop understanding of concepts, and the relationships between concepts, and not merely 'do' maths. To be continued in coming newsletters...

Coding and 3D Printing

Students across Year 3, 4 and 5 today were treated to a coding and introduction to 3D printing workshop.

Working collaboratively students learnt more about how computers need specific instructions or code to perform certain functions.

Students were also challenged to design a 3D snowman using "Tinkercad" which was then sent to the 3D printer!


