#### Dear Parents,

## "Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love."

On Tuesday we celebrated the feast day St Teresa of Kolkata who throughout her earthly life imitated Christ through tending the sick and the dying in Kolkata's slums and helping people there and beyond see the material and spiritual poverty that confronts modern society. She taught all—from youth groups to governments—through piety and charm, wisdom and simplicity.

St Teresa saw Jesus in everyone—from the child in the womb, to the sick and vulnerable, especially those afflicted with AIDS, to the

aged and dying abandoned in the streets of Kolkata. She urged people everywhere to reach beyond themselves to heal those hurting about them. Mother Teresa as she was so fondly known transcended cultures and



politics as she spoke of God's call to love and assist the poor. She had a profound realization that anyone she was with immigrant, alien, president or prime minister, was first of all a child of God and intrinsically worthy of respect.

Her life stands as a reminder to all of us that we are called to care for one another and especially that we are called to respect and aid the poorest among us.

As the children commence their Mission units of work in Religious Education lessons, it is role models like St Teresa and St Mary McKillop that they look to for inspiration.

Please keep our children in your prayers as they live out our school values of care and compassion over these next weeks.

Religious Education in Catholic schools has always aimed to develop children's capacity to express their growing understanding, appreciation, thoughts, questions and insights into God, Jesus, the Scriptures, the Church, the Sacraments, Prayer and life as a Christian. This is essential to their participation in the religious life of the school and the parish.

Teachers are continually assessing students' learning and reporting to you on their developing religious literacy. This year staff has focused on student responses to Scripture at the Spiritual Sense in the student's assessments. The Spiritual Sense is breaking open the Scripture to learn about God in the passage, identify the Catholic teachings and the connection to one of the Sacraments.

You might like to try the following questions with your children for parable, the Good Samaritan, Luke 10:25 – 37. This parable is being introduced to Years 3 and 4 during their Mission Unit—*Spiritual Sense*.

How does it reveal Jesus? God? What Sacraments are present? What connections can I make to Catholic teaching, practice and tradition? Can I identify Catholic values? How does it lead me to Heaven?

## Showcasing Children's Learning

This term parents have had and will continue to have a number of opportunities to share in their



children's learning. Last week Year 4 parents visited the hall to view the children's Religious Literacy projects based on a reflection of the Prodigal Son. This week parents visited classrooms to read books to the children. In Week 9, Year 3 parents have been invited to attend the Inaugural St Bernadette's Travel Expo and in Week 10 Year 6 parents will attend the Risky Business Expo. Each of these opportunities for parents is also a great opportunity for our children to experience the reaction of an audience to their real world learning. Thank you to all our parents for encouraging your children in their learning.

#### Thank you for your support of the Student Council War on Waste initiative – Waste Free Wednesdays – we are already seeing the difference!!!

The SRC have made a commitment to try and reduce the waste that we generate at St Bernadette's by encouraging all our children to bring in a waste free recess and lunch every Wednesday.

They ask that ALL the children bring in food that can be: Eaten; Composted; or Recycled.

This means that no food that is pre packaged. (No chip packets, muesli bars, or chocolates.)

Think fresh food like sandwiches, fruit and veggies. This will avoid throwing items away.

The SRC recommends that parents try to package children's food in reusable containers as they are a handy way to pack a waste free lunch. Packing a waste free lunch also promotes healthy eating and may provide a better understanding of the actions we can take to reduce our waste.

Don't forget – **EVERY Wednesday** pack a waste free lunch.

## Children's Workbooks Coming Home

Literacy books will be coming home next Friday. We encourage you to talk to your child about their exciting learnings this term. What new skills have they learnt?



What new ideas/information did they find out? The children are extremely proud of their work and even more so, to read a comment.

We encourage you to write a comment to your child in their book after their last piece of work. Children really do enjoy your comments and it allows us to see that the book did indeed leave the school bag and that you have taken the time to walk through it with your child. Additionally, we ask that the books be returned promptly the next school day so that your child can continue their written work in the appropriate book. **Children entering the school from Brisbane Road** Parents are reminded that children who enter the school from Brisbane Road in the mornings, come up the stairs from the bus bay area and walk across the bottom car park via the crossing. Please do not tell your children to walk up the driveway and then across the car park near the roped off section. Cars enter the driveway and this is dangerous. Some children have been moving the rope or going under the rope rather than using the stairs. Thank you for regularly discussing this with your children. Thank you for all that you do to keep our children safe.

Vehicles **do not** enter the school via Old Northern Road. Please ensure that you enter via Brisbane Road and exit via Brisbane Road turning left during the required times before and after school.
