# "I have set an example for you"

This week as the Year 5 students commence preparation for their participation in the formal leadership of the school in 2018, I have shared with them my beliefs and understandings about leadership.

Thank you to our fabulous P& F for the very generous donation to the school of \$70,000.

A significant amount of this was as a result of the 2017 Fun Fair and all our families are to be thanked for their support, promotion and attendance at the Fun Fair. # Celebration Sing Out Raises \$30,000 for Music Therapy

In October our school choir participated in 'Celebration Sing Out', an annual fundraising event that supports Music Therapy in the Children's Hospital, a therapy that makes a huge difference to the treatment and recovery of many sick children.

Along with all the choirs that participated our children contributed many hours of rehearsal and preparation in their lunchtimes and rehearsed on the concert weekend. This year 'Celebration Sing Out' raised

\$30,000 for Music Therapy – this is double the amount raised last year, and beats our previous best of \$25,000.

Well done and thank you to all our choir children the other schools that performed, the orchestra members and our teachers Mrs Evans, Mrs Blazevic and Mrs Donnelly and our parents and families. We look forward to 'Celebration Sing Out' in 2018.

# Safety in Car Pick Up and Driving through the Car Park

# **BUS SAFETY**

# Driving safely near school buses

Parents and carers are reminded that there is a 40km/h



speed limit for traffic passing a school bus that is setting down or picking up school children. This speed limit is for all traffic travelling in the same direction as the bus, whether the bus is stationary or moving. Lights will flash on the front and back of the bus reminding drivers that there may be children crossing or about to cross the road. Buses can't stop quickly because they are large and heavy vehicles. So, remember:

- Reduce speed to 40km/h when bus lights are flashing
- · Give way to buses
- Watch out for children crossing
- Never park in or near a bus stop or bus zone.
