


St Bernadette's School



Dear Parents,

The word 'compromise' is not readily accepted by many people because in some way it seems to suggest a 'backing down' or a lack of courage to face a situation or confront a person. When people take a stance in a situation that says that they are totally correct and that other people are totally wrong, there is bound to be conflict and people are destined to be hurt in some way.

Father WF Lynch SJ provides us with a balanced opinion when he writes about 'The Beauty of Compromise':

- Compromise admits the existence of other people
- Compromise does not wish to win a total victory over anyone
- Compromise refuses to live life on the terms of one single rigid idea
- Compromise will never deal the final, dehumanising stroke to any person or group
- Compromise thinks that there is but one God and neither you nor I are He
- Compromise will not destroy the 'self' by imposing on it impossible ideals that only create hopelessness
- Compromise is colour blind to black and white
- Compromise is the language of equals and not of slaves and tyrants

It would seem that Father Lynch is encouraging us to 'strike a balance' as we deal with the variety of situations that life throws up to us. The Gospels recount a number of occasions when Jesus was called upon to come up with a solution that trod the middle ground whist remaining true to principles yet accommodating the law.

As parents we should never forget that when we have difficult situations to deal with, we have within us the gifts of the spirit as firstly given to us at Baptism and then fully bestowed in Confirmation.

Liturgical Seasons

Just as we mark our lives by anniversaries, the Church celebrates the mysteries of Christ's life in a pattern.

Within the cycle of a year the Church remembers and celebrates the Paschal

Mystery, the birth, life, suffering, death,

Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus.

The Church's liturgical cycle recalls the Paschal

Mystery over a yearly cycle. At mass we also remember the Paschal Mystery and are constantly nourished by the story of Jesus and the body and blood of Jesus in the Eucharist.

The seasons are Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter.

Apart from these seasons, there are 33 or 34 weeks of the year that do not celebrate a particular aspect of the mystery of Christ but are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects. This period of the Church calendar is called Ordinary Time, which is the period we are now in. The liturgical colour for Ordinary Time is green.

The children in Year 4 who are preparing to celebrate their First Eucharist, can point out the items in the Church that are coloured to reflect the season of the church. The students can also explain why the priest's chasuble is a different colour. *Mrs Shane Robinson—REC*

Mid Year Reports

Reports for the first semester of the year will be distributed towards the end of this term. Students in Kindergarten will receive a report where the level of achievement is reported on using a scale of Working Towards, Working At and Working Beyond. Years 1 to 6 have an A to E reporting system.

- A describes students who have an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content. They have a very high level of competence and can apply the skills and knowledge to new situations.
- **B** describes students who have a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content. They have a high level of competence and are able to apply the skills and knowledge in most situations.
- **C** describes students who have achieved a sound understanding of the content and skills and have an adequate level of competence in these areas.
- **D** describes students who have achieved a basic understanding and knowledge of the content and skills and have a limited level of competence.
- **E** describes students who have achieved an elementary knowledge and understanding of the content with teacher.

To put the A-E reporting system into perspective, it may be helpful to look at the analogy below for driving a car. Where do you fit on the scale?

Important Parent Information:

Early Morning School Arrival

Early morning supervision commences at 8:00am. Parents dropping their children at school prior to 7:45am MUST drop their child in the Kiss 'n Drop Zone in the middle car park level. Children walk into the school through the gate and make their way down to the passive grass where they remain seated until 8:00am when the early morning duty commences. Parents have been observed dropping their children at the bottom of the school and sending them to enter the school via the gate in the bottom carpark. This gate is NOT open for student access until 8:00am. Please do not drop your child in Brisbane Road before 8:00am because your child will not be able to enter the school grounds. The safest way for your child to enter the school at this early hour is from the Kiss 'n Drop Zone if you are driving your child to school. If you are walking your child to school you can use the walkway leading up to the COSHC building and the children can make their way through to the school from there.

Thank you for keeping our children safe by dropping your child safely at school in the KISS 'n Drop Zone.

Arriving at School on time is Important

Our school day commences at 8:30am every morning. This means that your child needs to be within the school grounds at 8:30am every morning ready to enter class

with their teachers and friends when the bell goes. If you bring your child to school after the 8:30am school bell you must take your child to the office and sign them in. This procedure is outlined in the Parent Handbook.



It is a sign of respect for the school procedures and rules that all children arrive on time to school. Regular lateness teaches children that punctuality is not important. Schools are required by law to record all partial attendances and parents are required to provide reasons as to why children are not in attendance for the gazetted school hours.

On Monday mornings the whole school comes together for our Monday Morning Assembly – a time when we pray together, acknowledge birthdays and achievements and sing our National Anthem and raise our flag. Thank you to all those families who ensure that like every other day their child is at school at 8:30am. It is very noticeable that a large number of students are regularly late for Monday assemblies. You are asked to address this if your child is one of those children.

SAFE ADULT, SAFE PLACES' MESSAGE

You are reminded to regularly discuss with your children the 'Safe Adult, Safe Places Message'. It is extremely important that you keep the school informed in writing about any changed going home arrangements that you have made for your children. This avoids any confusion and also ensures that your child is safe.
