This special day is very important to our school because it reminds us of how in our everyday lives we too can be saints - living the message of the gospels and upholding our school values.

Generations of students have been educated at St Bernadette's over the past 62 years and each student who has been educated here has memories of what they have learnt about our patron saint, in particular her commitment to "Striving to grow with the courage as she showed Strength through Gentleness."

The generation of students currently being educated at St Bernadette's proudly sing our school song in liturgies and on special occasions. When we do this we are celebrating the life of St Bernadette, recognising our proud rich history and renewing our commitment to our school motto "Strength through Gentleness". On Friday 13th we will be reflecting on the life of St Bernadette of Lourdes who our Parish and school are named after.

St Bernadette was born on January 7, 1844, in Lourdes, France and died April 16, 1879 in Nevers. She was a young girl whose visions of the Blessed Lady led to the founding of the shrine of Lourdes.

Bernadette was the eldest of 9 children from a poor family. She often suffered from ill health. Between February 11 and July 16, 1858, at the age of 14, she had a series of visions of the Virgin Mary in the nearby Massabielle grotto, from which the Parish newsletter takes its name. Mary revealed her identity with the words "I am the Immaculate Conception" and, among other messages and affirmations, told Bernadette that a chapel should be built there. Bernadette steadfastly defended the genuineness of these visions despite strong opposition from her parents, the local clergy, and civil authorities, and she faithfully transmitted Mary's messages. However her humility, truthfulness and modesty encouraged many others to believe in her visions.

A few years after her visions she became a nun and took the name Sister Marie Bernadette. She was later canonised by Pope Pius XI who authenticated her visions and the veneration of Mary as Our Lady of Lourdes.

I would like to invite parents to join in our reflection of St Bernadette with the celebration of mass on Friday 13th April at 9:15am in the Church.
