Dear Parents,

"Remember this: The person who plants little will harvest only a little. But the person who plants much will harvest much. Each person should give what he has decided in his heart to give. A person should not give if it makes him sad. A person should not give if he is forced to give. God loves the person who gives happily." 2 Cor: 9,6

A couple of years ago the people of Greenbelt in England came up with the idea of Living Generously. This idea was based on a common concern that looking after this planet and its people is what we are all here for; if as many people as possible could make small changes to their everyday choices, then over time they would make a big difference for everyone. So, for the Year of Living Generously, people volunteered to commit to do two actions a month to make their lives more generous to the environment, to the poor and to their communities.

It was thought that most people were worried about their world, which simply meant that they saw the problems. What was needed were people who were concerned and so set about finding solutions. Some of the simple choices that people made were to give away unwanted clothes, appliances, furniture; to become an organ donor; to reduce car kilometres by choosing to walk or use public transport for one day; to take a mug to work and not use plastic cups; to say grace before meals so as to express gratitude for what they have; turn off the tap whilst cleaning teeth; to donate blood; wear an extra jumper instead of turning on the heating. Through making small changes to their lives they could become more eco-friendly, more thankful and appreciative, more community-minded, less consumption oriented. They could make a difference if they acted together to live more generously in the world. They were motivated by the possibility of releasing a positive social virus into the atmosphere as well as being a Christian group involved in action that stands for things - not against things.

We can all be inspired by the idea of Living Generously, for if we continue our emphasis on unnecessary consumption, on big is best, on the idea of 'must have' simply because it's available, then we are providing ourselves with more efficient ways to arrange the world in such a way as to cause us to lose our ability to experience it. Maybe, by embarking on a life of living more generously, we'll discover it was how we were supposed to be living all along.

"God of all creation, May our lifestyle choices be thoughtful of their impact on the environment. May we learn the art of Living Generously and be accountable for the personal piece of creation You gave to us. Amen."

Our community believes that every day counts for every child. Our attendance levels are recorded below. Our target is for at least 90% attendance for each student. A big congratulations to Year 2 for achieving 100% of children reaching that target! Well done! Our outstanding notes for absences continue to be reduced. Thank you for attending to these in a timely manner. While our overall attendance is still above our target we have noticed a drop in all grades with the exception of Kinder and Year 2. Social Skills—Weeks 8, 9 & 10 Having the ability to 'Bounce Back' (Self Management)

Over the next weeks and the remainder of the year the children and teachers will be using the words BOUNCE BACK to recall the resilience skills they are developing. The children will be presented with the words as an acronym and you can use this with them at home when talking about their social interactions. This acronym helps children and young people to memorise and recall 10 basic coping statements based around positive selftalk.

All of us can 'Bounce Back' from experiences if we feel that we have the support of others and can talk to someone when needed. We continue to encourage all of our students to speak to us and their parents when they have concerns. Our school aims for everyone to feel that they belong and feel included with a help at hand when needed.

Bad times don't last. Things always get better. Stay optimistic.

Other people can help if you talk to them. Get a reality check.

Unhelpful thinking makes you feel more upset. Think again.

Nobody is perfect. Not you and not others.

Concentrate on the positives (no matter how small) and use laughter.

Everybody experiences sadness, hurt and failure, rejection and setbacks sometimes, not just you! They are a normal part of life.

Blame fairly. How much of what happened was due to you and others?

Accept what can't be changed (but try to change what you can).

Catastrophizing exaggerates your worries. Don't believe the worst possible picture.

Keep things in perspective. It is only part of your life.

Collecting children from school

Please park in the main car park and then collect children from the Tuckshop area. Children are cared for in the Office if something unforeseen happens. Children are not left unattended under any circumstance. Please be very careful when backing out of car spaces in the car park. Be aware of pedestrians and other traffic in the car park.

Car Pick Up Service - this operates from 3pm every day. Vehicles enter the car park via Brisbane Road and display a 'yellow number card' in their front windscreen. This number is then called out and students proceed to the teacher on duty who guides them into the car and then parents drive down the driveway to Brisbane Road. There is **no** right hand turn at the bottom of the driveway. Thank you for your ongoing assistance. It is much appreciated.
