

Confirmation

Many of our students in Year 6 and St Bernadette's Parish are preparing to receive the sacrament of Confirmation. Although we normally receive this sacrament after First Communion, the Church considers it to be the second of the three sacraments of initiation as it completes Baptism.

In our Baptism, our parents and godparents make the promises for us, during Confirmation we as adult Catholics renew our faith for ourselves. The introduction to the Rite of Confirmation states:

'by the sacrament of Confirmation, the baptised are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, they are, as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed.' We pray for all the children as they are sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and strengthened in their Christian life.

On Saturday, the children of the parish will take part in Spirit Day as part of their Sacramental preparation. The Confirmation ceremony will take place on Saturday 22nd September.

Student Council War on Waste initiative – Waste Free Wednesdays Don't forget – EVERY Wednesday pack a waste free lunch.

Suggestions for what a waste free lunch can look like?

Congratulations to all our families. As a school community we have been making a huge effort in moving towards having a waste free school through promoting action and change within the school. This includes the introduction of our 'blue bins' and the Waste Free Lunch initiative. A Waste Free Lunch means trying to pack items that can be composted or recycled and that won't end up in the garbage bin. That means, avoiding plastic wrap, foil, zip lock bags and packaged foods. If your child brings packaged foods to school they can take their litter home with them.



Remind your children to look out for the blue wheelie bins in our playgrounds.

These blue wheelie bins have been provided as part of our Waste Free Initiative. Children are encouraged to dispose of their single use drink containers into one of these bins. The containers will then be taken to a Return and Earn point.

Being A Problem Solver At St. Bernadette's (Self Management)

Problem solving is a tool, a skill and a process. It is a tool because it can help you solve an immediate problem or to achieve a goal. It is a skill because once you have learnt it, you can use it repeatedly, like the ability to ride a bicycle, add numbers or speak a language.

At St Bernadette's we encourage the students to use a range of thinking skills, plan and carry out investigations, consider different strategies, find things out before making decisions and solve a variety of problems at school and at home.

Teaching children to become effective thinkers is recognised as an important goal of education. For students to function successfully in a highly technical society, they must be equipped with lifelong learning and thinking skills necessary to process information in an ever-changing world.

What's happening in Maths @ St Bernadette's?

Save the date! Parent Information Session - Mathematics - Tuesday 25th September

On Tuesday 25th September St Bernadette's will be running a parent information session on Mathematics, with a focus on multiplication and division. This workshop is to inform parents how students use mental strategies in multiplication and division and develop their multiplicative thinking, from Kindergarten to Year 6.

This will be a workshop with a difference as it will commence at 8:30am in the library and will be followed by open classrooms during a Maths lesson. Parents will have the opportunity to go into classrooms and observe students engaging in multiplicative tasks aimed at developing mental computation strategies.

This is a wonderful opportunity for parents to work in partnership with the school, witnessing firsthand the mathematical learning children are engaging in daily at St Bernadette's.

I hope that you are able to join us and I am looking forward to this opportunity to work alongside you. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me should you wish to know more.

Did you work out last week's brainteasers?

1- The bus I caught was number 1441.

Here's one way to work it out:

- If it has four digits and it's less than 2000, the first digit must be a 1.
- Since it's the same forwards and backwards, the last digit must also be 1.
- Since all the digits together make 10, the middle two digits must add to eight.
- Since the number is the same forwards and backwards, the two middle digits must be the same, so they must both be 4.

2 - Clocks often have their numbers in Roman numerals, so 12 is written XII. If you cover the bottom half of XII, you'll get VII, which is seven in Roman numerals!


I'm having trouble using the online RSVP link.
