Dear Parents,

Today I hand over my front page article to Savannah and Kiara, Year 6 students who on behalf of our students and families wrote the letter below to accompany our generous donation to the Wilcannia Forbes St Vincent de Paul Office in support of Farming Families during this period of drought

Dear Members of the Wilcannia Forbes Diocese and St Vincent de Paul Society, Our community at St Bernadette's started to hear about the devastating drought that you are experiencing in your region and knew that we had to do something about it. On Tuesday 14 August, we were invited to dress as Farmers for the Day and bring along a donation to support farmers in the Wilcannia Forbes area. The fundraiser was called 'Dig Deep for the Farmers'.

At the beginning of the day we sang along to We are Australian to remind us that we are all part of our country and we all belong. As Australians and Catholics we support each other especially when someone is in need. Our Catholic community has raised money because you are our Australian farmers, you are in drought, and you support the whole NSW economy. A lot of our St Bernadette's students brought in money to support the hard battles you have been facing.

Some of the students gave amazing reasons why they donated money and where they got it from. One of the students donated her money from something she called a 'share jar'. She explained it was a jar that she put every bit of her money into for a charity. She saw that this was a concerning matter so she donated ALL of her share jar money to the struggling farmers.

One of our Year 3 students also kindly donated some money because her grandparents have experienced similar tough circumstances and she felt she also wanted to help. So she donated her money to the Farmer Fund, hoping it would help a lot! Another student at St Bernadette's was talking about how he donated money out of his piggy bank. Our very generous Parents & Friends Association helped us by donating \$500!

The reason all of our students donated money to your district was because of the associations that a number of students and staff had in this area. As a school community we raised a total of **\$7401!** We are very proud of the generosity of our community and we hope the money donated will help the farmers in the challenging circumstances they are experiencing.

From the bottom of our hearts "we just want the mums and dads and boys and girls to know that we are

Why is St Bernadette's striving to minimise waste on site?

Like all schools, St Bernadette's can produce large amounts of waste. However, it is our aim to send as little waste as possible to landfill. This will lead to considerable benefits for the environment and many opportunities for the students to learn environmentallysound attitudes and habits for their everyday living. Our SRC set us the challenge in 2017 to implement Waste Free Lunches everyday. Commencing Term 4 we will be promoting our Waste Free Lunches and Recess Everyday. A Waste Free lunch and Recess means children having a reusable lunch box and drink bottle and parents trying to pack items that can be composted or recycled and that won't end up in the garbage bin. That means, avoiding plastic wrap, foil, zip lock bags and packaged foods. If your child brings packaged foods to school they can take their litter (plastic wrap, foil, zip lock bags, yoghurt containers etc) home with them. We will provide containers for food scraps and single use drink containers so that these can be recycled.



Remind your children to look out for the blue wheelie bins in our playgrounds. These blue wheelie bins have been provided as part of our Waste Free Initiative. Children are encouraged to dispose of their single use drink containers into one of these bins. The containers will then be taken to a Return and Earn point.

Multiplicative Thinking Tuesday 25th September

We are looking forward to opening our classrooms to give you an opportunity to see our maths learning in action. We will meet together in the library at 8:30am before moving to classes.

Did you work out last week's brainteaser? Last week's question

You've just received a secret coded message:

AD, BA, BH, CE, DB, DI, EF

You know it follows a pattern, but can you work out what pair of letters come next?

Clue: You might have noticed that the first letter in each term is further along the alphabet. What if the pairs of letters represented numbers?

Answer

You can convert the letters to numbers using a simple substitution: A = 1, B = 2, C = 3 and so on.

This gives us the sequence:

14, 21, 28, 35, 42, 49, 56

You might notice that they're all multiples of seven! That means the next number in the sequence is 63.

Taking it back through the substitution code, we get the answer, FC.
