Dear Parents.

Welcome back to all our families and staff. I can tell from the children that they enjoyed the break and the opportunity to spend time with their families. During the holidays a very energetic group of parents and students completed gardening throughout the school - our bottom vegetable gardens and our gardens in front of the administration block. October is the month of the Rosary when the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on the 7th October. Pope Francis has asked Catholics all over the world to join him in a campaign to say the Rosary every day in the month of October.

With the request to pray the Rosary, the Pope has asked to include two important prayers, Suub and the Prayer to St Michael.

The Suub prayer is the oldest prayer we find in the church that evokes Mary. The second prayer that the Pope has asked us to add at the end of the recitation of the Rosary is the Prayer to St Michael the Archangel. According to some sources, the prayer was instituted in 1886 by Pope Leo XIII to be said after Mass.

Over the next few weeks, all classes will be spending some time learning about the Rosary and the children are invited to bring in their rosary beads to use while praying together in class. Each week the class prayer bag goes home, with a set of rosary beads and a copy of the Rosary to assist you in praying the Rosary as a family.

Social Skills—Term 4 Weeks 1, 2 & 3— Personal Goal Setting- (Self Management)

During this term our classes are learning about how being organised and setting goals helps them to be successful. They will also be thinking about factors that help or hinder achievement of their goals:

- Outside distractions can prevent me from achieving my goals.
- It is important to overcome outside distractions to reach my goals.
- I may not always achieve my goal the first time.
 Outside distractions may get in the way.
- I can have another go, come at it from a different direction, try again and overcome any outside distractions
- To be successful I decide that no matter what happens, I can work out how to reach my goal.

Some classes have been using the *Mountain Climber* analogy. To be a mountain climber you need to climb over mountains (overcome many outside distractions) to reach your goals. This analogy shows what students should do when outside distractions get in the way of their goals. Climbers have to climb over mountains to get to the finish line. The mountains are outside distractions, and to get over the obstacles, climbers have to do something. If the climbers allow the mountains to stop them, they will not reach the finish line. If students let outside distractions stop them from taking action, they will never reach their goals!

Something to try at home:

- 1. Talk with your children about what distractions get in their way when trying to achieve a goal.
- Younger children might draw a picture of some mountains and write down things that prevent them from reaching their goals.
- 3. Older children can begin to think about different types of distractions – external as well as internal (thoughts and feelings that cause us not to make the necessary effort). I can have another go, come at it from a different direction, try again and overcome any outside distractions.

To be successful I decide that no matter what happens, I can work out how to reach my goal. Even as adults, we encounter many mountains and need to overcome obstacles to achieve our goals. Allow your children to see you as a 'Mountain Climber' and how you overcome the distractions to meet your goals in life.



2019 Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials

Currently only the Summer Sports of BASKETBALL & TENNIS are open and registrations close on Wednesday 31st October as these trials will be held in November 2018. All OTHER sport registrations will open in November for 2019 trials.

Any primary students enrolled in Year s 5 and 6 in 2019 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term Four in 2018 and Term One & Two in 2019.

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in Years 5 & 6 in 2019 be invited to attend.

Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in the following sports:

*AFL (boys), Basketball (B&G), Cricket (B&G), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Netball (girls), Rugby League (11yrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), Softball (B&G), Tennis (B&G), & Touch (B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au.

This online form is an EXPRESSION OF INTEREST for the 2019 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. Parents may complete this form to attend a selection trial. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST** be approved by the child's school. In order for the child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of the school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. All fields and especially "Representative Experience" MUST be completed. Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date. Student Leave


As part of the implementation of the formulated National Standards, holidays taken by students outside of school vacation periods will now be included in Student Attendance Data as absences.

School student applications for 2019 open from Monday, 15 October 2018.




