

Dear Parents,

No doubt there has always been and will always be a tension between wanting to make our children happy and putting limits on their behaviour: Too much love and affection and a child becomes spoiled, expecting their every need and want to be met regardless of other people's needs and wants; too much discipline and control and a child develops a low sense of worth and a lack of self-control.

Basically, our parenting instincts are good ones. If we use our head and trust our heart, then, we will mostly make good decisions. Our aim should be to teach our children to understand their own behaviour, to be responsible for their choices and respect themselves and others.

Sometimes, by looking at the extremes of parenting behaviour, we can clarify what we want and need to be. For example, if we chose a "strict" style we would be demanding, punishing and not allowing our child choices. We would demand total obedience and discourage independence; we would resort to yelling and threatening to impose control. The result for our children would be low self-esteem, an inability to think for themselves, the risk that they might become followers and follow those who don't have their best interests at heart. If we chose an "easy-going, slack" style we would set no guidelines, provide no structure and avoid asserting authority; we would be uninvolved and unavailable and

make no demands. The result for our children would be lack of self-control, immaturity in their thinking process; they would be irresponsible and so accustomed to having their own way, that they would become very frustrated in situations where they can't have their own way and perhaps become aggressive.

Maybe we need to seek refuge in the adage, "All things in moderation."

We need to have a well balanced approach to parenting where we set high standards, firmly enforce rules and encourage independence; we need to be able to be good at two-way communication – having our say and listening – and be able to give and take. In return our children, hopefully, will be responsible, independent and aware of the needs of others, have healthy self-esteem and confidence and know the importance and benefits of self-control.

Half Yearly Report Meeting for All Year One Parents and all interested Parents

A parent meeting will be held in Week 7 on Wednesday 13 June at 7pm for ALL Year One Parents AND any other parent who would like to learn more about the Year 1 to 6 reports. This is a compulsory meeting for all Year One parents as it contains essential information for parents whose children are moving from the Kindergarten report at the end of last year to the half yearly Year One report. This meeting will be a great opportunity for parents to have any questions answered that they may have about half yearly reports. Parent Interviews

Next week the School Interview booking site will be opened for parents to make appointments with class teachers as part of the half yearly reporting cycle. Reports will be sent home with children on Wednesday 27th June 2018. Interviews will take place from Thursday 28th June 2018 with the late interview evening being Wednesday 4th July 2018. The teachers look forward to this opportunity to meet with parents to discuss the learning of their children.

This year in response to parent and teacher feedback about the timing of interviews please note that we are trying to improve the punctuality of all interviews and the amount of time that parents are able to meet with teachers. For your information:-

- •Interviews will be spaced at 15 minute intervals, though it is not expected that most interviews will take up the whole 15 minutes.
- Parents are requested to contact the teacher to schedule an appointment at another time if they need an extended interview that will take longer than 15 minutes.
- •Parents who have more than one teacher to see are asked not to book consecutive time slots so as avoid running late for the next appointment. The location of classrooms makes it impossible to move in time from one interview to the next if the appointment is booked back to back with another appointment.

- •If you are running late for your interview time, your interview can only take place for the booked time so as not to impact on the schedule of other interviews.
- •Teachers will have a commitment to the published Interview Timetable that appears outside each classroom / learning space and they will appreciate parents also adhering to the time allocation.

An email will be sent to parents on Tuesday 12th June with all the details needed to access the online booking site.

We look forward to meeting with you and discussing your child's learning progress.

SRC Waste Audit

On Wednesday this week the SRC held a waste audit.

We collected all the rubbish, counted it and then sorted it to see where most of our rubbish was coming from.

We were shocked to see how much rubbish there was! There was a lot of food thrown away that was not touched.

A lot of food was only partially eaten and could have been kept for later. There were drinks bought from the canteen

and opened but then just thrown away? So why did someone buy it?

We counted over 600 pieces of rubbish for the day! It was really disappointing that there was so much rubbish on the day we try to be waste free. We estimated that 60% of the waste could have gone home in lunch boxes!



Our top three waste areas were plastic wrappers from chips and biscuits, plastic containers from drinks and yoghurts and food scraps. We also noticed a lot of plastic sticks from lollies.

We need to do better and look after our environment! So can we remember to use reusable containers for our snacks and only bring what we need so there is less waste?

If we don't finish our food we can take it home for a snack later in the day. If we all work together we can make our school better!

Safe People, Safe Places

Parents are reminded to regularly remind children of the following:-

- Make sure your parents or another adult you know knows where you are at all times.
- Always walk straight home or to the place you are walking to. Walk near busier roads and streets, or use paths where there are lots of other people.
- Know where safe places are a shop, service station, police station, library or school. If you are ever frightened, you should go to one of these places and ask them to call the police.
- Learn about safe adults you can look for and talk to if you need help police officers, teachers at school, adults you know and trust.
- Don't talk to people you don't know and never get into a car with someone you don't know. If a car stops on the side of the road and you don't know the person inside, do not stop.
- If you are scared and can use a phone, call 000 and tell them you are scared.
- If someone tries to grab you, yell out, 'Go away, I don't know you'. This lets other people know you have been approached by someone you don't know.
