Dropping off and Picking Up Procedures

A huge thank you to our parent and grandparent volunteers who have helped out in the car park this week. Thank you also to the majority of our families who are following all the guidelines for parking in the school grounds and entering the school



via Brisbane Road. It is disappointing though that there are some drivers who are putting the safety of our children and family members at risk by choosing to ignore the guidelines or the requests from our volunteer parents who are assisting in the car park in the mornings. I would ask those drivers to reconsider their decisions in light of safety and respect to other families. Those drivers who continue to enter the car park from Old Northern Road are particularly placing our children at risk. As parents we are role models to our children and it is certainly not a good example to children if parents ignore the requests made by the school. It is extremely important that everyone in the school community adheres to these requests so that we can keep our children safe.

CENSUS—CHANGE OF DATE-MONDAY 18TH FEBRUARY

If you know that your child will be absent on Mon 18th **February**, please email the school explaining their absence prior to the day. Likewise, if your child is unexpectedly absent on the day, please email the school by 10:00am on Mon 18th February simply advising your child's name, class, the reason for their absence and when they will return. Please note: Auditors have advised that written advice from parents is mandatory. This is a requirement that applies to every day of the school year, however, Census data is directly related to Government funding for our schools and the requirements outlined above are set by the Department of Education.
