

Social Skills

Weeks 5 & 6 Choosing our Words and Actions Wisely- ('Respectful')



Learning to make good decisions enables children to develop independence and responsibility. A good decision is one that is most likely to lead to a positive outcome for everyone concerned. What we say and what we do relates to the decisions that our students make on a daily basis. Choosing the right words and actions to use in appropriate situations is a necessary skill for all people because it allows a community to function positively.

To make good decisions our children at St. Bernadette's learn to:

- Recognise when there is a choice for them to make
- Understand they are responsible for making the decision of what they do and say
- Take other's needs into consideration with what they say and the actions they engage in
- Think of possible choices or solutions and decide what is best

Steps for decision-making.

1. What do you have to decide about?
2. What choices do you have?
3. Weigh up the pros and cons of each option and choose the best option.
4. Put your choice into action and then check how it works out.

Helping children to take responsibility

Children will often focus on immediate wants without considering the long-term consequences of their decisions and actions. To learn to take responsibility and make good decisions, children need to be shown how to use the decision-making steps and be given the opportunity to practice making decisions. Children do not learn to make good decisions overnight.

Parents and carers can help children develop their decision-making skills by:

- Keeping decision-making manageable by providing a choice between two options that are realistic for the age and ability of the child.
- Listen enthusiastically to children's explanations and encourage children to explain their choices as this teaches them to develop their thinking processes and think through their choices.
- Use questions to encourage children to make judgements (eg 'Do you think this will work?', 'Is that a good idea?')
- Involve children in family decision-making (eg. Planning holiday activities). This encourages children to take others into consideration when making decisions.

ICAS Mathematics and Writing

2019 Results

Our ICAS test results have arrived and once again St Bernadette's students have received outstanding results.

The maths competition assesses all aspects of the maths curriculum and in particular the student's ability to apply their knowledge to solve real life problems while writing test assesses students' ability to complete an extended response to a given task. Two forms of writing, narrative and persuasive, are assessed in alternating years.

The marking is based on their use of the genre, their ability to achieve the writer's purpose, the engagement of the reader, the level of skill used in correct punctuation and grammar and the complexity of their vocabulary.

School Swimming Carnival 2019

The St Bernadette's swimming carnival will be held in Week 7, on Thursday 28th November at Blacktown Aquatic Centre, 4 Boyd St Blacktown. Blacktown is an indoor pool with plenty of seating for our students on one side of the pool and space for parents on the other side.



Students will pre-select races to participate in prior to the day, and all 25m and 50m races will be held in the 50m pool. Please consider this carefully when selecting events for your child as this is a pre-entered carnival and students will only be allowed to compete in events they are nominated in on the returned permission slip. Parents are advised that the school swimming carnival is a *compulsory part of the school's curriculum. Your child's attendance at school on the carnival day is expected. Please do not hesitate to contact Mrs Leanne Nettleton should you have any questions regarding your child's attendance on the day.*

This carnival encourages participation for all students and acts as a pathway for talented swimmers to progress through to Zone, Diocesan and possibly even State competitions in 2019 - based on the top two placings in each 100m/50m event for our school representative swimming team for 2019. The results of this carnival will decide our winning House for the Swimming Shield and will also be included to decide the winners for our House Cup for 2019.

Students attending the carnival are:

- All students Years 3 to 6 swimmers and non-swimmers
- Year 2 students who can confidently swim 50m in any stroke or 25m in freestyle or backstroke
- Year 1 students turning 8 in 2020 who can confidently swim 50m in any stroke
- All less experienced swimmers and non-swimmers in Years 1/2 will remain at school on the day.
