Is there really more than one way to show love?

In his book the *5 Love Languages*, Dr Gary Chapman, writes about the importance of meeting each other's deep emotional need to feel loved. He writes about each of us having a 'love tank' that when filled helps us to feel secure and see the world as a bright and wonderful place. He describes five love languages:- *Words of Affirmation, Gifts, Acts of Service and Physical Touch*. I include a brief description of his five love languages for you at this time when we are so busy and can often overlook the little things that our many relationships are built upon:-



Words of Affirmation

"The tongue has the power of life and death" (Proverbs 18:21) Actions don't always speak louder than words. Hearing the words 'I love you' are important words – hearing the reasons behind that love sends your spirits skyward.

Acts of Service

Can vacuuming the floors really be an expression of love? Absolutely! Anything you do to ease the burden of responsibilities will speak volumes to those we love. The words that we all want to hear are 'Let me do that for you'.

Receiving Gifts

When we receive gifts it makes us feel recognised, cared for and loved – especially when that gift represents thoughtfulness and insight into knowing just who we are.

Quality Time

Nothing says 'I love you' better than full, undivided attention. Really being there for others - with the TV off, knife and fork down and all chores and tasks on standby, makes others feel significant and special.

Physical Touch

Hugs, pats on the back, holding hands, and thoughtful touches on the arm, shoulder or face can all be ways to show excitement, concern, care and love.

Let's all make the commitment today, when we are so busy to be attentive to showing those acts of love.

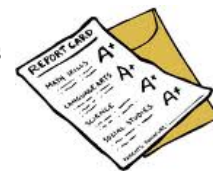

End of Year Reports

Reports will be coming home on Tuesday 10th of December 2019. It is a mandated requirement that school reports (Years 1 to 6) award an achievement level to each child using a 5 scaled system (A,B,C,D,E) for each KLA. It is important for parents to note that under this system the mid-year report refers to the first half of the year's teaching and learning and subsequently the end of year report refers to the second half of the year.



The second half of the year introduces different concepts, content units and skills. It is therefore possible that your child's achievement in a particular Key Learning Area may be different.

*Example One: Half Year Achievement level of C
End of Year Achievement level of C*

Your child is continuing to have a sound understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.

*Example Two: Half Year Achievement level of B
End of Year Achievement level of C*

In the first half of the year your child had a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In the second half of the year different concepts have been covered with different learnings gained. Both examples may well illustrate that your child is working to their potential.

Teachers on grade teams meet together to determine what constitutes an A, B, C, D or E and work samples and assessment information are moderated according to the syllabus standard for each KLA. As directed by the Diocese, Year 1 to 6 will also have comparative data included in their reports. This applies to all Diocesan schools.

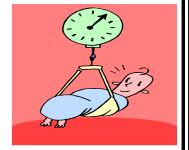
