#### STOP PRESS!

Catholic Schools NSW have declared next week (Monday-Thursday) as Staff Development Days-Pupil Free Days. These days are to enable staff the opportunity to prepare for online/remote learning that will continue next term.

There will be limited supervision of students for those who require it. Lessons will not take place and the children will be in common areas and supervised by a staff member that will not be their class or grade teacher. Before and After School Care will continue to operate as normal for those children enrolled.

Teachers will not be expected to post work for your children as the children are now on 'holidays', though I know that all classes have lots of 'just for fun' activities and sites listed on the Google Classroom or See-Saw platforms. Your child could always complete any finished work that was previously assigned if you need to keep your children entertained.

I wish to congratulate all parents and care givers for the amazing support you are giving to your families. I know remaining calm and in control can be difficult at times, especially with your children around 24/7 as well as working from home, though you truly are an inspiration.

Please remember to take some time out from the routine to breathe fresh air and rejuvenate. The last week of Lent is called Holy Week. Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday (this Sunday) and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ into Jerusalem, just days before he was crucified.



Holy Week ends on Holy Saturday which is the day before Easter Sunday.

Palm Sunday is known as such because the faithful will often receive palm fronds at mass which they use to participate in the re-enactment of Christ's arrival in Jerusalem. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect. Palm branches are a widely recognized symbol of peace and victory, hence their preferred use on Palm Sunday.



The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic too as it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war.

You can use the following Prayer with your family for Holy Week.

#### Prayer for a Celebration of Holy Week

Jesus, Our Redeemer and Lord,

Enter into my mind and heart as Holy Week unfolds and open me to the grace of this sacred time.

Through its symbols and stories, awaken in me an awareness of your great sacrifice, made so generously on our behalf.

As I gather with other members of my parish family, fill me with humility, gratitude, and reverence.

From the solemn celebration of Palm Sunday to the opening of the Triduum on Holy Thursday, may my focus remain on you.

As I listen once again to the agonizing story of your passion, death, and burial, may I learn what it means to say, 'your will be done.'

And, throughout the quiet space of Holy Saturday, may I await, dormant and expectant, for your rising to new life as Easter dawns.

I ask this in your holy and blessed name.
