Next Tuesday is Shrove Tuesday. 'Shrove' means being forgiven for wrong doings. Another name for Shrove Tuesday is Pancake Day. A long time ago this was a day for feasting and having a good time. People went to church to confess the bad things they had done and would be forgiven before the start of Lent. As rich foods such as eggs were forbidden during Lent, one way of using them up would be to make pancakes.

### Wednesday, 26th February is Ash

Wednesday and this marks the beginning of Lent. The season of Lent goes for forty days and is a time for Catholics to prepare for Easter. Lent is usually a time of fasting and repentance as well as a time for reflecting on

Christ's suffering and sacrifices for us. When we receive ashes on Ash Wednesday we



have made. Ash Wednesday signals our choice to turn away from sin. We turn over our lives to Jesus and we try to become more like

Lent is a season of penance. During Lent we admit that we have turned away from Jesus. We admit that from time to time we have been selfish and unkind. We are sorry that we have sinned. We want to make up for our sins so that we can grow closer to Jesus.

During Lent we show that we are sorry and that we want to be better by doing three things. We pray, we fast and we do kind deeds for other people. Doing kind deeds is called almsgiving.

On Ash Wednesday, Years 1 to 6 will attend either the 9:15am Parish Mass or the 12 noon Parish Mass. They will receive the ashes on their forehead and hear these words 'turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel'.

Kindergarten will have a short prayer service in the hall and then receive their ashes.





### Fact Sheet for Parents and Caregivers - Explanation of Absences

CEDP promotes daily school attendance. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education.

If your child is sick or absent you are required to notify their school on the first day of absence if at all possible. All explanations to the school must be provided within **7 days** from the first day of any period of absence.

Absences can be explained using one of the following methods:

- Email: the school at bernadettech@parra.catholic.edu.au
- 2. Telephone: the school office 02 9407 6600
- 3. Note sent with your child

Where an explanation has not been received within the 7 day timeframe or the explanation has not been accepted, the school will record the absence as unexplained or unjustified on the student's record. The school will not be able to accept explanations which are not received within the 7 day timeframe.

Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick or having an infectious disease
- · having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral

### Why do I need to notify the school if my child is absent?

Parents of children aged 6 to 17 years are legally required to ensure their children attend school every day or provide an explanation if they are absent. Notifying the school and providing an explanation for your child's absence will fulfil this legal responsibility.

The safety and wellbeing of students are the highest priorities for schools. Parents need to know if their child isn't at school, and schools need to know when and why a child is absent. Notifying the school of your child's absence helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of all children in school.

### What is your responsibility?

- Ensure your child attends school every day
- Notify the school immediately if your child is absent
- Provide an explanation for any absences within 7 days
- Make sure the school has your correct contact details so that you can receive attendance information about your child
