Mr McDowell has been working with the Parramatta Diocese over the last couple of years and has presented at system learning days as well as working with individual schools. Mr McDowell will return to St Bernadette's for a short visit in June, where he will meet with some teachers and possibly walk through classrooms to see the amazing work that teachers and students are doing.

#### Vision Valley Camp - Year 5 2020

After three busy weeks of hard work, Year Five travelled to our very first and memorable leadership camp on the 13th -14th February. We participated in various adventurous activities such as water sliding, teamwork filled raft building, fun filled archery, and we had such a great time at giant crate stacking. These activities assisted us in working on our teamwork skills and developing responsibility. Before everyone got messy, we had a liturgy about our theme for the year, 'Challenge Your Limits'. We read a scripture revolving around our theme. Prayers of the faithful were spoken and songs were sung.

When we arrived it was pouring with rain but we still persevered to get to our cabins. A little rain never hurt anyone (unlike a few who didn't have a raincoat and complained about having wet hair). Along with our teachers, we met our fabulous camp guides who helped us throughout our camp experience. We grabbed our raincoats, put on our gumboots and headed off to our liturgy. We were greeted by a statue of Mother Mary, Lectio Divina cards, hope and faith centerpieces and many more objects relating to our slogan that we were about to learn, 'Challenge Your Limits'. We then read a scripture that challenged our thoughts and ideas (One Body With Many Members- 1 Corinthians 12:12-27). This passage showed us how we are all one and no one is less important than others. We all come together to form one community, Year 5 2020. We trekked back to our cabins so we could find out our groups and our first well awaited activity.

Despite the gloomy weather Year 5 went on with their activities. First up for our group was raft building. We got into teams and put on our thinking caps. We learnt to give each other the equal opportunity to share our ideas then decide on the best strategy. Everyone got muddy but we put our survivor faces on, tied up the knots and tested our rafts. Two people from each team got paddles and put on their life jackets to test our creations. The boys were up first. Douglas and Michael hopped onto their raft and tested it out. It was going smoothly until they started to wobble. They toppled over and got soaked. Maya and Audrey tested the other raft which was built. The raft glided into the water then.. their raft collapsed. No raft riding for the girls.

For our second activity, we participated in exhilarating archery. We were taught how to wield a bow and arrow just like Robin Hood while still keeping safe and out of harm. We worked in teams of three and four, everyone cooperating and getting a chance to show off their skills. Some people even got the chance to use the compound bow with Miss El-Hage even managing to score a bullseye.

The last activity of the day was giant crate stacking. For this activity, I believe that Year five really did challenge their limits with this highly anticipated activity, fighting through the murky weather and working perfectly as a team.

Everyone eventually jumped down from the crates with style, singing the James Bond theme song on the way. Though some people struggled with their harnesses, we had a great time during this one-of-akind activity. Afterwards, we clambered up the rocky hill back to our cabins, patiently awaiting a well-deserved shower and gourmet butter chicken for dinner.

On the second and final day, we proceeded to water sliding. We had been waiting for this activity for so long and we finally got to enjoy it! Even though this activity didn't involve teamwork, it involved sharing. We grabbed our mats and headed up the staircase. We shared some jokes, riddles and laughs! We learnt a move called the 'sushi roll'. We wrapped ourselves in our mats and layed on our backs. We went 2x faster when this move was used. The teachers, including the principal Mrs Cooke, participated in water sliding! They had a blast although their hair was sopping wet! It was a great activity to finish camp with.

All in all, camp was the best experience of Year 5 so far. Vision Valley taught us to be responsible and brave, to bond with one another, to learn and to become leaders. Vision Valley taught us not to be afraid to make mistakes. We are grateful for this opportunity and we hope future Year 5 students enjoy camp as much as we did.

#### **Birthday Cakes**

#### **School Fees**

Term 1 School Fee accounts should have been received by now. Fees are due on Wednesday, 18th March 2020. Flexible Payment Plans (FPP) will again be offered in all schools in the Parramatta Diocese 2020. The FPP is an alternative to our current payment terms of 30 days and offers families the choice to pay their annual fees weekly, fortnightly or monthly over either a six month period from March to August (Standard Plan) or nine month period March to November (Extended Plan).

Fees can be made by cheque, credit card, EFTPOS, BPAY or POSTBILLPAY. If you take advantage of the BPAY facility to pay your school fees, you will need your biller code and reference code which are located on the bottom right hand side of your school fee account. Please allow 2 days for all BPay and POSTBILLPAY payments to reach our account. A reminder to all families that a term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing MUST be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term and where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit will be calculated. Where a term's notice has not been given to the Principal the terms school fees will be charged for your child/children.
