NAPLAN Update

On Monday the 23rd of March Year 5 and Year 3 will participate in a Compulsory Practice test of NAPLAN. This will have no influence on student performance, it is a test of the sites used and our system capabilities. We will conduct the trials in test like conditions using the same processes so the students will become familiar with this.

Harmony Day

Harmony Day occurs on the 21st March each year. It is a day in which Australians celebrate the core values of inclusiveness, respect for other cultures, tolerance and diversity. It is a day that began in 1999 and coincides with the UN's International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination. Orange is the colour chosen to represent Harmony Day. At St Bernadette's we will be recognising Harmony Day on Friday 20th March and invite our school community to wear their national dress or an orange t-shirt or orange accessory, eg ribbons, socks, shorts, joggers or hat to school on the day to show our support and inclusivity of our school community.



Parents are invited to attend a Prayer Service on Friday 20th March at 9am on Top Court. Our school leaders will lead us in prayer and scripture, and our acknowledgement of country. We invite any parents who might like to read a prayer in their native language with their children to read the prayer in English to contact the office. At the conclusion of our Liturgy we will have a parade of National Dress.

Friday 20th March is also Bullying No Way Day so the children will spend the morning session on understanding what bullying is and how we can stand together to say, "Bullying. No way!"

The middle sessions K-6 will spend time together in classes learning about Harmony Day. Our day will end with assembly at 2pm in the Church.

Bullying

National definition of bullying for schools

Developed by educators across Australia

Bullying is an **ongoing** and **deliberate misuse of power** in relationships through **repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour** that intends to cause physical, social and/or psychological harm. It can involve an **individual or a group** misusing their power, or perceived power, over one or more persons who feel unable to stop it from happening.

Bullying can happen **in person or online**, via various digital platforms and devices, and it can be **obvious** (overt) or **hidden** (covert). Bullying behaviour is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time (for example, through sharing of digital records).

Bullying of any form or for any reason can have **immediate, medium and long-term effects** on those involved, including **bystanders**. Single incidents and conflict or fights between equals, whether in person or online, are not defined as bullying.

Parent Teacher Meeting This Week

What we can do

Student tips

If it happens in person, try these:

- **Ignore them.** Try not to show any reaction.
- **Tell them to stop** and walk away.
- **Pretend you don't care.**
- **Go somewhere safe.**
- **Get support** from your friends.

If it happens online, try these:

- **Avoid responding** to the bullying.
- **Report and block** anyone who is bullying online.
- **Protect yourself online** using privacy settings and keep records.

If you see someone being bullied:

- **Leave negative conversations.** Don't join in.
- **Support others** being bullied.

If it doesn't stop:

- **Talk to an adult** (parent/carer/teacher) who can help stop the bullying.
- **Keep asking** for support until the bullying stops.

Parent tips

If your child talks to you about bullying:

1. **Listen** calmly and get the whole story.
2. **Reassure** your child that they are not to blame.
3. **Ask** your child what they want you to do about it and how you can help.
4. **Visit** www.bullyingnoway.gov.au to find strategies.
5. **Check in** regularly with your child.

Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information.
