Dear Parents,

As we move to Week 3 and the introduction of the gradual return to school plan, our teachers are excited about seeing more children in their classrooms each day. Our teachers have worked tirelessly to ensure your child's online learning tasks are the best they can be and the teachers have been providing so much feedback that their eyes have gone square and their fingers numb from all the typing! They are looking forward to the day when life returns to normal. Teachers have always known that being a teacher is so much more than providing content- it's about that connection with a young learner and that personal encounter that helps a learner to thrive.

Even though more students will be coming to school for face to face teaching from this week, remote/online learning will continue. A reminder that SCHOOL IS OPEN FOR ANY CHILD and ANYDAY that you require. The House Colour plan is a way to encourage all students to attend school at least one day a week, if possible. As always, we respect all parental decisions about school attendance at this time of the COVID-19 situation and if you choose to continue to keep your children home fulltime for now, that is fine.

When at school, children will be involved in a mixture of face to face learning opportunities with their class teacher as well as online learning tasks set for their grade. Please be aware that teachers will not be able to provide immediate feedback or answer emails and questions to remote learners as quickly as they have been able to in the past few weeks, as they will be teaching some sessions to the children onsite each day. Regular updates by your child's class teacher are posted on your child's See-Saw or Google Classroom account. As always, if you have an urgent problem or question, please ring the office for assistance. This Sunday is Mother's Day and sadly we haven't been able to celebrate this special day in the usual way here at St Bernadette's. I do hope that you all remember your mum and give thanks for the wonderful woman that she is. For those mums no longer with us, they are forever remembered with love.
