# R.E. NEWS

Just as we mark our lives by anniversaries, the Church celebrates the mysteries of Christ's life in a pattern. Within the cycle of a year the Church remembers and celebrates the Paschal Mystery, the birth, life, suffering, death, Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus.

The Church's liturgical cycle recalls the Paschal Mystery over a yearly cycle. At Mass we also remember

the Paschal Mystery and are constantly nourished by the story of Jesus and the body and blood of Jesus in the Eucharist.

The seasons are Advent, Christmas, Lent and

Easter. This Sunday we will remember the Ascension of Our Lord. The fortieth day after Easter Sunday, commemorates Jesus' ascension into Heaven. If you see Mass or get to go to Mass this Sunday you will see the Priest in White Vestments and a White cloth on the Altar. The Easter Season ends with Pentecost Sunday (Sunday 31st May) where the altar and the priest's vestments will be red.

Apart from these seasons, there are 33 or 34 weeks of the year that do not celebrate a particular aspect of the mystery of Christ but are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects. This period of the Church calendar is called Ordinary Time, which is the period we are now going back to. The liturgical colour for Ordinary Time is green. During Ordinary Time there might be some Sundays where green is not on the altar or

the colour of the priest's vestments, and this is when a Solemnity occurs on a Sunday such as 'The Most Holy Trinity'.

The children at school also notice the change in Liturgical season with the Prayer table cloths changing to the colour of the Liturgical Season.

# TSA Instrument Lessons


