#### **Resilience Part 2**

You may recall from last week's newsletter that I addressed Resilience and recommended an article to you by Michael Gross. Here are points 3 & 4 for you to read and think about. (Points 1 & 2 were **Turn** requests for help into problems for kids to solve and Ask good questions to prompt problem-solving)

# 3. Coach them through problems and concerns

Imagine your child feels they were unfairly left out of a school sports team by a teacher and asks you get involved. The easiest solution may be to meet with the teacher and find out what's going on. You may or may not resolve the problem but in doing so you are teaching a child to become dependent on you. Alternatively, you could coach your child to speak to the teacher themself and find out why they were left out. Obviously, there are times when children need their parents to be advocates for them such as when they are being bullied, but we need to make the most of the opportunities for children to speak for themselves. Better to help your children find the right words to use and discuss the best way to approach another person when they have problems. These are great skills to take into adulthood.

# 4. **P**repare kids for problems and contingencies


You may coach your child to be independent – walk to school, spend some time alone at home (when old enough), catch a train with friends – but do they know what to do in an emergency? What happens if they come home after school and the house is locked? Who do they go to? Discuss different scenarios with children whenever they enter new or potentially risky situations so that they won't fall apart when things don't go their way. Remember, the Boy Scouts motto – 'Be Prepared!'



In Term 2, Year 4 have been learning about the Structure of the Mass, and the significance of Sacred Objects and vessels used in the Mass.

They have looked at the altar which is the table or structure on which the church's sacred meal is celebrated.

This sacred meal makes present the sacrifice Jesus made for us by dying on the Cross and it is a thanksgiving meal



They found that the altar is the table that the community gather around under the leadership of the Priest to remember God's love for us and give thanks for the living memory of Jesus who show us the way to the Father in heaven.

They learnt about how the word chalice comes from the Latin word 'calix', meaning cup. The chalice is also called a sacred vessel and is held in special honour by the worshiping community as it is the cup that holds the Blood of Christ when the wine is consecrated at Mass.

All chalices used at a Eucharistic Celebration are to be made of precious metals as a sign of the importance of these sacred vessels. They discovered that patens or plates are what the hosts for communion are placed on. Like the chalice the paten is to be made of precious metals as it is also called a sacred vessel as it will hold the Body of Christ once the words of consecration are said by the priest at Mass.

Using their knowledge of the Mass, sacred vessels and the church building from this term, the children have designed a Sanctuary decorated for a Church's

season and showing a particular time in the mass.

# PBS4L

PBS4L is Positive Behaviour Support for Learning. It is a school wide positive behaviour support approach that aims to develop social and learning outcomes. It supports us with teaching our school to follow our school agreements of- At St. Bernadette's: We are Respectful, We are Resilient, We are Safe and We are Learners.

Students will participate in lessons with their teachers to discuss what it looks like, sounds like and feels like when they are displaying the 4 agreements across the school. Students will earn "Bernie Roo" tokens in their learning spaces and on the playground for displaying our school agreements.



When students display these agreements they earn "Bernie Roo" tokens within the classroom and on the playground and are told what agreement they are displaying to receive the token. They will receive an acknowledgment of this by receiving a Bernie Roo card with the teachers signature once they receive 10 tokens.

Bernie- Roo is a our school mascot and our message is-St Bernadette's - The Bernie Roo Way, following our 4 overarching school agreements and maintaining our school values (respect, honesty, tolerance, forgiveness, care and compassion) and motto of 'Strength through Gentleness'.
