Eileen O'Connor was the co-founder of the Our Lady's Nurses for the Poor in Coogee and she was recently made servant of God by the Vatican.

A number of years after her death in 1921 a formal request was made to consider her for

sainthood. The congregation submitted their request to the bishop of the diocese where Eileen died. This request tells how the person lived a life of holiness and list reasons for considering Eileen



for sainthood. The Bishop, after considering the evidence believed there was enough evidence to consider Eileen for sainthood so he asked the Vatican to open a special tribunal. Witnesses have been called to attest to Eileen's holiness, devotion to God, and other virtues. Eileen has just passed this first step, and she is named a "Servant of God'.



Eileen O'Connor experienced a life of physical suffering and poor health and cofounded the religious institute of Our Lady's Nurses for the Poor in Sydney. Deeply religious, Eileen claimed to have received a visitation from Mary, mother of Christ, who encouraged her to accept her suffering for the good of others. She told only McGrath of this and he shared with her his hope of establishing a congregation of nurses to serve the poor. Eileen entered into his scheme with enthusiasm and on 15 April

1913 moved into a rented house at Coogee which, known as Our Lady's Home, would serve as a convent for the new congregation.

The enterprise did not prosper and all recruits, except O'Connor, left the Coogee house. Gradually they were replaced and a small community of seven, called Our Lady's Nurses for the Poor, elected O'Connor as their first superior.
