Through prayer we are being called into a dialogue with God. Lent is a time to focus on prayer, so we can build that relationship with God. A first step is that we need to make a commitment for a time and place to pray. But how to pray? How to find God's voice inside our noisy minds and busy schedules? How to guiet down and listen? 'Lectio Divina' is an ancient form of prayer that's accessible to all. The church provides daily



Scripture readings that can be the gateway to prayer.

Choose a daily reading and go through it slowly. Pause and recall a word or phrase that particularly speaks to you. Spend time reflecting on what moves you. Then slowly read the entire text again to put the phrase into context and explore deeper meaning. You could read Matthew 17:10 – 3, which is Sunday's Gospel. Jesus continues the mission of John to reconstruct life in community. Because God is Father, we are all brothers and sisters. Jesus joins together two loves: love toward God and love toward neighbour, making both visible in the way people live together.

After reading the Scripture, here are some reflection questions for you to reflect on: · Placing myself in the position of the disciples: does consumerism have power over me?



• Placing myself in the position of Jesus: Do I have the desire and determination to create a new human way of living together?

These will take place in Week 8 (16-20th March) with a late evening interview day being held on Wednesday 18th March.


Interviews will be booked through the School Interview Website and are now open www.schoolinterviews.com.au Event code: **y3ajb**

NAPLAN dates for 2020 - Year 3 & 5

In 2020, NAPLAN (National Assessment Program -Literacy and Numeracy) will take place during the test period of Tuesday the 22nd of May until Friday the 22nd of May. As was the case last year, all assessments for Year 3 and 5 will take place online with the exception of the Year 3 Writing paper (remains a pen and paper written test).

The NAPLAN assessments provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. It is just a snapshot of all their learning taken in just under 4 hours. It is one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student achievement.

School Fees

A reminder to all families that a term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing MUST be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term and where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit will be calculated. Where a term's notice has not been given to the Principal the terms school fees will be charged for your child/children.

Student Leave

As part of the implementation of the formulated National Standards, holidays taken by students outside of school holiday periods will now be included in Student Attendance Data as absences.
