On Friday we reflected on the life of St Bernadette of Lourdes who our parish and school are named after. St Bernadette was born on January 7, 1844, in Lourdes, France and died April 16, 1879 in Nevers. She was a young girl whose visions of the Blessed Lady led to the founding of the shrine of Lourdes.

Bernadette was the eldest of 9 children from a poor family. She often suffered from ill

health. Between February 11 and July 16, 1858, at the age of 14, she had a series of visions of the Virgin Mary in the nearby Massabielle grotto, from which the Parish newsletter takes its name. Mary revealed her identity with the words "I am the Immaculate



Conception" and, among other messages and affirmations, told Bernadette that a chapel should be built there.

Bernadette steadfastly defended the genuineness of these visions despite strong opposition from her parents, the local clergy, and civil authorities, and she faithfully transmitted Mary's messages. However, her humility, truthfulness and modesty encouraged many others to believe in her visions.

A few years after her visions she became a nun and took the name Sister Marie Bernadette. She was later canonised by Pope Pius XI who authenticated her visions and the veneration of Mary as Our Lady of Lourdes.

On Monday 26th April, Week 2 we will commence the day with a special prayer service at our Monday morning assembly on top court to remember those who have died in wars and to commemorate ANZAC Day.



Welcome back to Term 2. This week we are beginning to have a regular 5 minute session of meditation. We are using the Smiling Mind App which draws the students attention to their breathing which in turn can relax their body. So far all the students have given it a go and I can see there are some 'professional meditators' in the school. Many students have told me they do meditation at home. That's great!

We are also talking about goals. Setting goals is a life skill that can help us succeed.

By setting goals we have a clear direction of where we want to go, like a road map. Understanding the importance of goal setting is useful from a young age as it gives students a sense of purpose. This is vital for

Playing our part to Build a National Picture of Child Health



In early 2021, our school, along with thousands of others across the country will begin preparations for the fifth Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC gives us a national picture of the development, health and wellbeing of children in their first year of full-time school. Since 2009, the census results have helped communities, schools and governments plan services and develop better policies to target support for children and families.

Children don't miss any class time, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information for the census. The AEDC gives us data at a school and community level - it isn't an assessment of individual children.

Some teachers have also noticed that completing the assessments made them more aware of the needs of individual children and the class as a whole and that the census results are useful in planning for transitions to Year 1 and developing class programs.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.
