R.E. NEWS

This Sunday is solemnity of The Most Holy Trinity. Pope Gregory IX instituted Trinity Sunday in 828 CE. This day is known for being the only major Christian festival that celebrates a church doctrine rather than an event in its sacred



history. It is dedicated to the Christian belief in the Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – and falls on the Sunday following Pentecost each year. The belief of one God in three elements is a distinctive of the Christian faith but the early church was plagued by contrary views. Trinity Sunday spread throughout the western church around the 14th century.

In some churches, the liturgical colour is white on Trinity Sunday. Images of the Trinity of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit depict that there are three elements of one God. The Trinity is sometimes symbolized by a triangular shape formed by three overlapping oval rings or loops, each featuring one of the following images: the crown (father) within the top loop; the lamb (son) within the second loop (clockwise); and the dove (spirit) within the third loop (clockwise).

Wellbeing Library

During the next two weeks we are discussing something that affects everyone; WORRIES.

Worries are thoughts you cannot get out of your head about real, potential or imagined problems.

When we worry or experience anxiety, our body can change in several ways. The symptoms may include: increased heart rate, upset stomach, feeling hot, sweating or shaking and not being motivated to get involved with other activities.



It is important for students to recognise their worries so that they can work out whether they are worth giving a lot of their thought time to. Writing worries down is a strategy that makes students feel as though

they have done something constructive. We have stressed that sharing your worries with someone is also very important.

Over the next week the children will write their worries on a slip of paper and keep it safe in an envelope. Here are the links to the resources we used in our lessons:

feedback from others, learning from mistakes, and finding new ways to approach tasks involves having a growth mindset. When children learn putting forth effort and using the right strategies can help them improve, they feel empowered, they are more confident, resilient, and are not



afraid of mistakes - after all mistakes help us learn. We would encourage you to have the conversation with your child(ren) about the importance of being a learner who has a growth mindset. As always, our



approach is acknowledging all of the good choices that your children display at school, allowing for the development of a strong school community.

A person on 'L' plates, must always be accompanied by an experienced driver.	A person on 'P' plates, drives independently but still learning.	Full drivers licence, like most of us!	Advanced driver training with extra skills.	Grand Prix racer!

As you can see, most students will be 'Working At' which is where they are meant to be in their learning. As with driving a car, most of us do not have Advanced Driver Training, nor are Grand Prix racers! The same applies to student achievement. Of course, we always aim for the best that we can possibly do!
