Feast of the Sacred Heart is observed on June 11, 2021. The Feast of the Sacred Heart (properly the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus) is a solemnity in the liturgical calendar of the Roman Catholic Church. It falls 19 days after Pentecost, on a Friday. The Feast of the

Sacred Heart has been in the Roman Catholic liturgical calendar since 1856.

Today, on the feast of The Most
Sacred Heart, we celebrate God's creative
love bursting forth into the heart of creation,
into the heart of humanity. It is a day to
reflect on the boundless love that God has
for each person. In essence it speaks of the
great tenderness of a God who stoops down
and lifts us up when life is filled with
challenges and suffering. God's love
reaches out to us, invites us, and draws us
into the very heart of God where our lives
are transformed into being the hands and
feet, the gentle voice and the listening ear of
Christ in the world today.

In essence the feast of the Sacred Heart is about celebrating the goodness, kindness and compassion that was at the heart of Jesus' ministry.

Jesus lived his life centred in the heart of God. Jesus's life embodies this compassionate way as he reaches out to touch the eyes of the blind man, brings life and hope to the widow of Nain and restores dignity to the Canaanite woman. This feast day calls us to honour through our encounters the sacredness of the other and to live centred in the heart of God.


On this feast day, let us lean into the heart of Jesus as John did at the Last Supper and become a heartbeat of God's love in the world.

Thank you to all who have thought of others on this feast day by generously donating to the St. Vincent de Paul Winter appeal. Together we raised \$1,842.00.




#### Wellbeing Library

We concentrated on recognising the signs of the YELLOW zone so we could be able to do something to keep us from losing our anger or having a tantrum and going into the RED zone.

We learnt about the brain and understood why we lose our temper which will hopefully help next time we are starting to feel our anger creeping in. In the Infants we read a book called "I am Stronger than Anger" by Elizabeth Cole. We liked the title because all the children wanted to be stronger than their anger and make sure they were in charge.
