Dear Parents,

"Is there room for God in our life?"

Mother Teresa once wrote that: "The fruit of love is service, which is compassion in action. Religion has nothing to do with compassion. It is our love for God that is the main thing, because we have all been created for the sole purpose to love and be loved."

If we allow God to have a strong presence within us and to guide us towards an inner peace, we will be happier human beings and not stuck in negative thoughts.

"God, you are present in all your creation, open our minds and hearts to you so that your peace might seep into our souls. May our connectedness to you lead us to an inner wisdom through the comfort of your peaceful presence. Amen."

Part of the activity was to name something that the students would like to change about themselves. Some Stage 3 students bravely shared the differences they faced through autism and ADHD. We heard how they experienced life and how they handled activities and school work. It helped the other students to understand that they were not different but we are all different. One student cleverly said, "we are all the

Every single student said that it would be ok if their friend had different likes or had different ideas to them. With so many diverse students at St Bernadette's we are lucky that we are exposing our children to realise that while we are all

different we are all the same deep down. Out of such experiences comes a wonderful opportunity to develop empathy and acceptance. Dr Suess beautifully said, "Why fit in when you were born to stand out".
